ACADEMICS

Irmo High School hosts a variety of academic programs in an effort to engage students where they are most interested to support their post-secondary plans. We strive to offer elective courses that foster growth in academic achievement, personal growth, life skills, fine arts, and physical fitness.

Additionally, the International Baccalaureate Diploma (IB) Program, Advanced Placement (AP), and dual enrollment programs continue to challenge students academically and socially. Teachers utilize a variety of instructional strategies such as cooperative learning and feedback to engage student learning and to support continuous improvement.

ARTS

Irmo High is an arts focused school with a variety of options for experiences in vocal and instrumental music, dance, visual and performing arts. Unique opportunities like artists in residence in jazz band and African dance enrich the arts experience for students. Over 500 students in various stages of artistic exploration were active participants during the school year.



Our intentional focus of encouraging students to be in attendance every day is a part of our daily messaging. In collaboration with our school counseling department and social worker, we provide support to families to communicate the importance and connection of attendance and academic success.

ATTITUDE

Our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program allows for teachers to reinforce positive school culture as well as behaviors we expect of our students. As an extension of PBIS, a group of students, our Irmo Ambassadors, are positive peer influencers for the student body. This group serves a variety of purposes including welcoming new students, participating in community outreach, and serving as peer mentors. Also, in partnership with the school nurse, we have implemented a mindfulness technique and location called the Calm Corner.

This year, our football team was Region runner-up, and our girl's cross country team was Region Champion. Our wrestling team and the boys and girls basketball teams qualified for the state playoffs. The boy's tennis and both boys and girls soccer teams qualified for the state playoffs. Our softball team had their first winning season since the 2010 season. Over 50% of students participate in one or more athletic teams as student-athletes.
