SIC ANNUAL ACTION PLAN FOR 2021-2022

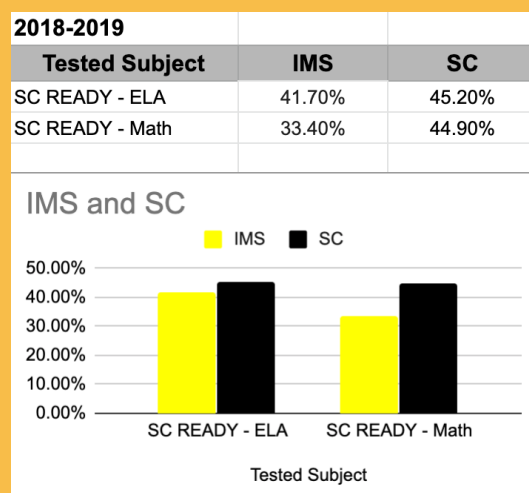
- Continue Parent University and IMPACT group to help our parents and community grow.
