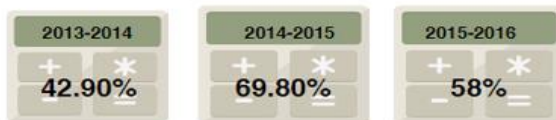

The scores below show the percentage of students meeting their growth targets in reading and mathematics each year.

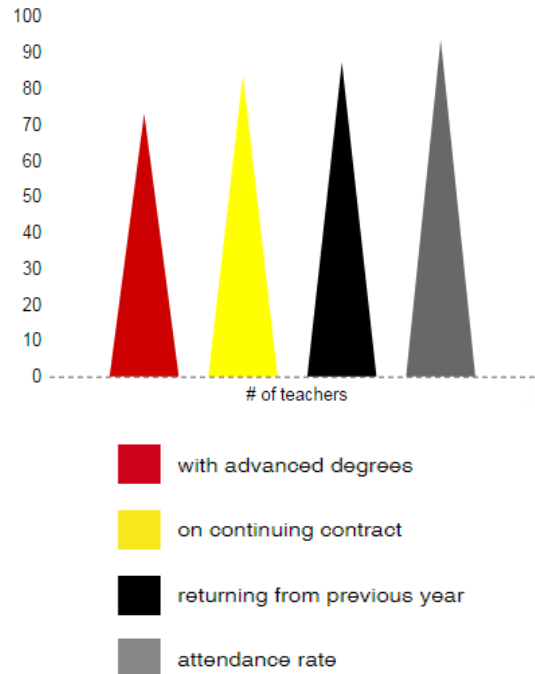


Reading

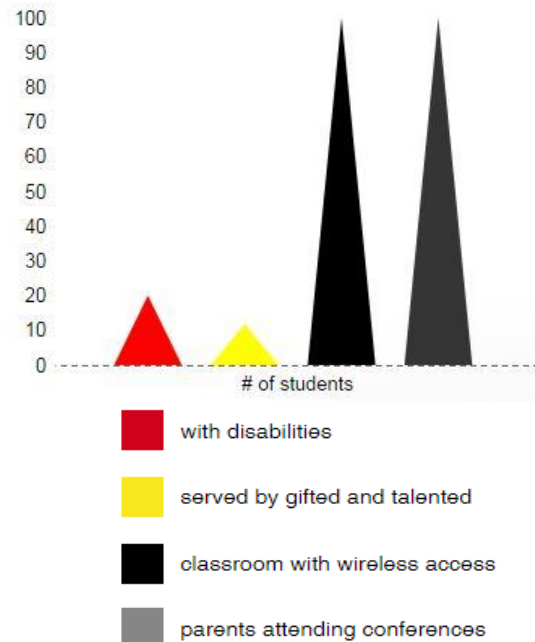


Mathematics

Goal Statements

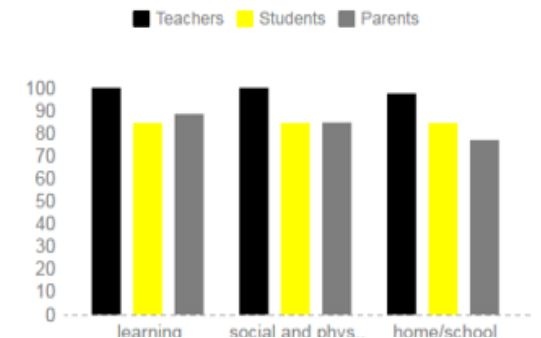
