

Mean RIT Score – The mean RIT score for a grade level is the average of all the RIT scores of the students in that grade at IES. A RIT is a unit of measurement of a student's academic growth on a continuum of skills in reading and math (just as an inch is a unit of measurement of a child's physical growth on a yardstick).

Irmo Elementary School participates in both norm-referenced (MAP) and criterion-referenced (PASS) testing. Our parents have received individual results of their students' MAP and PASS scores.
