Promoting Teaching and Learning Highlights

Seven Oaks Elementary School MEDIA Magnet is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing a variety of instructional practices informed by data. Grade level teachers meet as a Data Team to write common formative assessments, discuss data results, and determine specific instructional strategies to improve student achievement. Professional development and classroom support is provided by a full time Literacy Coach who works collaboratively with teachers to ensure student learning and growth in reading and writing. Teachers triangulate various data points to identify students needing specific intervention in reading and math. Identifying and using research based instructional strategies, interventionists and classroom teachers are able to meet the individual needs of students.

Seven Oaks Elementary School MEDIA Magnet is immersed in media and technology. Every student has an iPad or Chrome book that is used to enhance the learning opportunities and engage students in communicating, collaborating, and creating. A high tech production studio and radio station allows students to be creative and innovative in their learning. Students develop, edit, and produce videos and iMovies to showcase standards-based learning. The Film Festival (Golden Globes of Education) is held annually where students present media projects and earn recognition for their achievements. Students at our school are using the world class skills on a daily basis to problem solve and think critically.
