H.E. Corley Vision Statement

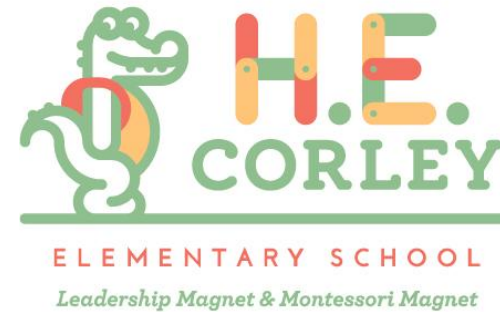

2020-2021 Objectives of HE Corley Elementary School

- ❖ By May 2020, 58% of 2nd, 53% of 3rd, 34% of 4th and 61% of 5th grade students will score at or above the 50th percentile in ELA as measured by spring MAP scores.
- ❖ By May 2020, 47% of 2nd, 54% of 3rd, 49% of 4th and 47% of 5th grade students will score at or above the 50th percentile in Math as measured by spring MAP scores.
- ❖ By May 2021 at least 90% of the teachers, 90% of the parents and 85% of the students will respond "agree" and "mostly agree" they are satisfied with the learning environment as measured by their responses to the state and school developed survey.

Strategies

- ❖ District and school based professional development geared towards providing effective instructional strategies.
- ❖ Provide differentiated instruction with a particular focus on the direct instruction model and a concentration on diversity and equity.
- ❖ Provide learning opportunities that incorporate critical thinking and problem-solving skills (Depth of Knowledge).

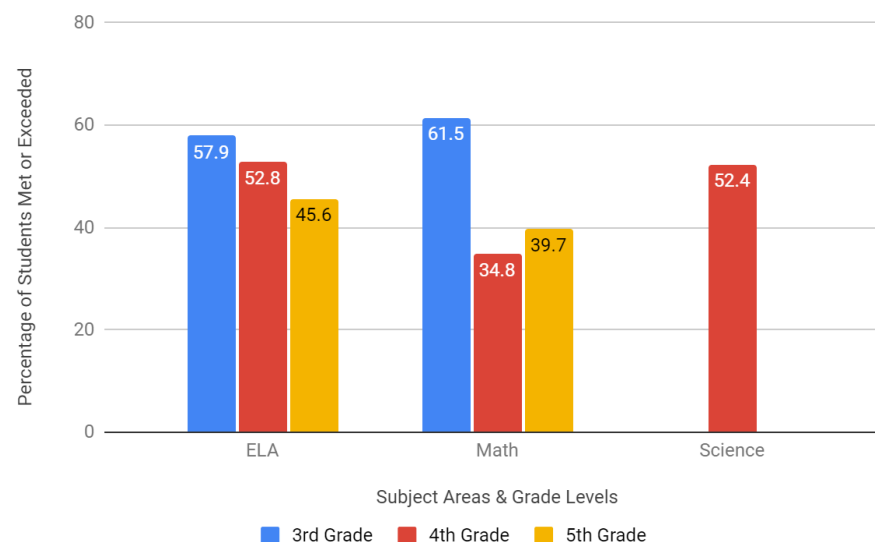
