SIC Annual Goals

The SIC goals rely in the area of maintaining continuous communication within the school and community.

The Strategic Plan for Crescent High School includes collaboration between the Literacy Team and forming relationships with area businesses. This collaboration includes working to promote literacy among the community and students.

Another goal of this committee is to ensure recognition and promotion of the students of Crescent High School. The school strategic plan outlines a plan for improving End of Course scores in English I and Algebra, ACT, and WorkKeys scores. A goal of this committee is to continue to support the recognition of student scores that are exemplary.

Student Achievement

Crescent High School has high expectations for student achievement. 89.3% of graduates complete high school requirements within four years. We have a 85.7% passage rate on the Biology End of Course and 73.7% passage rate on the US History End of Course assessment, which is above the state passage rate in both areas.

Crescent High School has a 90.9% passage rate on the AP Biology exam, 50% on AP Chemistry, 69.2% on AP US History, and 50% on AP World History. These scores are well above the state average.

Additional Information

It is the responsibility of Crescent High School to produce graduates who have the world class life skills and career characteristics of the SC Profile of the Graduate. CHS is working to accomplish this in many ways. Recently the school day was extended to incorporate a 40-minute period designed for acceleration and remediation. This extra instructional period allows for Advanced Placement (AP) classes to offer a lab period every other day. Students that are not participating in an AP Lab are working on End of Course, WorkKeys, ACT/SAT, and/or Accuplacer Preparation based on the year in which they are tested. Financial literacy is taught in all business classes with these students having the opportunity to earn MOS certification and EverFi certification. We have two Career Development Facilitators to assist students with job shadowing and work-based learning opportunities
