Initiatives and Strategies for School Improvement

- Continue the improvements towards the social and physical environment of the school.
- Expand the school-wide STEAM focus in 100% of our classrooms.
- Plan and deliver instruction that meets the individual needs of all students.

Fine Arts Highlights

Our Band program had 10 students selected for Region Band and 1 alternate to All-State.

The 8th grade band received Superior with Distinction at our State Concert Performance Assessment and Silver standard at the Southern Star Music Festival.

The jazz band scored straight superior ratings at the state Jazz Performance Assessment.

Our Orchestra program had 24 students selected for SCMEA Region Orchestra and 2 alternates. Four students were selected for SCMEA All-State Orchestra.

Capriccio, Concert and Honors Orchestra received superiors at the SCMEA Concert Performance Assessment.

Honors Orchestra and Concert Orchestra received the Gold standard award at the Southern Star Music Festival. Concert Orchestra was awarded the Sweepstakes and Grand Champion Award at the Southern Star Music Festival.

Chorus students traveled to Carowinds near the end of the year and both groups received an Excellent Rating for their performances.

A new Honors Ensemble, made up of auditioned students at DFMS has begun to meet on Fridays, from 3:45 to 5:00. These truly dedicated students perform music at a higher level than even our Honors Chorus Students and this ensemble gives students that are not enrolled in chorus an avenue for choral music.

First semester 7th Grade Art, 8th Grade Art, 7th Grade Honors Art, 8th Grade Honors Art, 2D Design , and 3D Design students had their Art Show in January. Our students then participated in the Art @ 5 District Art show which was held at Irmo High School in the Main Street Gallery on March 21st.

Instructional Philosophy

Our instructional program is driven by the three Rs: rigor, relevance and relationships. At DFMS, we meet students at their current academic level and challenge them with rigorous coursework so they can grow and reach the next level. DFMS teachers make the curriculum standards relevant to the lives of our adolescent students. This requires the infusion of technology and literacy across the curriculum. Finally, all interactions at DFMS are based on building positive relationships. This is paramount to developing our sense of school community.

Academic Highlights

The first chart below represents how our students performed on the past 4 state assessments in ELA and Math (SC Pass, ACT Aspire, SC Ready). The number represents the percentage of our students who "Met" grade level expectations on each assessment. The second chart shows how students across the State scored on the same assessments.

School Highlights

Clubs, Organizations, and Athletics

- *DFMS had 229 students take the PSAT this year and 63 of them qualified as National Junior Scholars.
- *DFMS had two teams compete at the USC PLTW (Project Lead the Way) Engineering Challenge for Design & Modeling and Automation & Robotics. Both teams represented DF well, and the robotics team won the Design Award.
- * DFMS has two Vex Robotics teams this year that have both been very successful. Both teams qualified for the state competition with high skills challenge scores and Team A won the State Championship title and qualified for the World Competition.
- * Members of the Math Counts team participated in the 2018 Math Counts Chapter Competition at the University of South Carolina. Two individuals from our team scored well enough to move on to the State competition.
- * The 2017-2018 Boys C-Team Basketball team won their fifth consecutive regular Season Championship. We finished runner-up in the Conference Championship.
- * In addition to participation in C-Team sports, we had many DFMS students who found success participating in high school sports such as: Cross Country, JV basketball, Lacrosse, Swimming, Tennis, JV and Varsity Cheerleading, Baseball, and Track.
- *ACTION students meet with career mentors throughout the year to design and implement service projects that relate to the students' career aspirations. Projects include creating an anti-bullying video with the S.C. State Museum and WACH Fox, designing and planting a bio swale and butterfly garden with a horticulturist, and completing a music memory iPod project to support caregivers and those with Alzheimer's. The club mentors students with special needs, participates in Special Olympics, organizes a toy drive for sick children, sponsors the "Be an Upstander" contest, hosts the annual Black History Month Celebration, and promotes Holocaust education. ACTION won Nystrom's National Civil Liberties Award and was named Champions of the Environment by DHEC.
- *Mock Trial won the regional competition and came in 4th place at the state competition.

 Multiple students won most effective witness and attorneys awards at both competitions.
