Fine Arts Highlights

- The band had seven (7) students who auditioned and were accepted to participate in the Region 2 Honor Band. The bands also had outstanding performances in the Winter and Halloween concerts.
- ♦ The orchestra had twenty-two (22) students selected to participate in the SCMEA Region 3 Orchestra event. Two students were selected to participate in the SCMEA All-State Orchestra event.
- ♦ The chorus had nineteen (19) students selected to participate in the District Honor Choir event. The chorus had an outstanding performance at their Winter concert.

The 8th Grade Honors Chorus performed the national anthem at all home basketball games this year and sang at one JV basketball game at DFHS. The 8th Grade Honors Chorus also participated in the band/orchestra Halloween concert and the drama production of "Our Town".

The DFMS Show Choir was formed this year as a before/after school club. Twenty-five (25) students participated during the year from chorus, band, orchestra, dance, as well as non-art areas.

The Dazzlers Dance Team represents a portion of our dance program at DFMS. This past season, the dance team placed in all 3 competitions they attended. The dance team brought home 2 first place trophies, 2 second place trophies and 2 third place trophies in the team division. Three Dazzlers on the team also competed solos and brought home 1st, 2nd & 3rd place trophies from all competitions.

This team has gone above and beyond to represent Dutch Fork Middle School and even won "Most Spirited" team at the competition.

- The Fine Arts Department held the very first "Fine Arts Feature" in which our Visual Arts programs and Theater programs were highlighted with supporting performances by student dancers, singers, and musicians.
- Spanish had 2 students that were selected as award winners in the Bilingualism Matters Student Poster Contest. This contest, sponsored by the Center for Bilingualism Matters Center at USC, included students across multiple districts who created posters to celebrate the importance of being bilingual. The theme of the contest was "What Bilingualism Means to Me".

School Highlights

Clubs, Organizations, and Athletics

- Both the girls and the boys basketball teams won the inaugural Lexington County Middle School Christmas Basketball Tournament. The girls basketball team made it to the conference semifinals and the boys played in the conference championship but lost.
- ♦ In addition to participation in C-Team sports, we had many DFMS students who found success participating in high school sports such as: Cross Country, JV basketball, Lacrosse, Swimming, Tennis, JV and Varsity Cheerleading, Baseball, and Track.
- ♦ The FCA prepared forty-nine (49) shoe boxes for Samaritan's Purse Operation Christ-mas Child. This is FCA's annual service project. FCA members, faculty and community members donated items that were distributed across the globe to children from birth to age 14 who live in impoverished areas.
- ♦ DFMS Academic Team placed 1st in the state during the Fall 321 Competition.
- ♦ DFMS Yearbook Club worked hard all year and completed a 120 full color page and hardback yearbook.
- ♦ The Mock Trial team finished 1st in their regional competition and placed 7th in the state competition.
- ♦ DFMS Jr. Beta Club had several community service projects this year. These include:
 - Lowman Home planted 500 plus flowers.
 - Presbyterian Home played bingo with residents and gave out prizes.
 - Operation Spread the Joy donated 400 plus items for homeless in downtown Columbia.
 - Clean of Heart donated 384 items for Columbia residents in subsidized living.
 - Animal Mission donated 122 items to a local animal shelter.
- ♦ The Math Counts Club had seven (7) students that attended the Chapter Competition at Hammond School. Four students placed in the top 20. The top 16 competed in a countdown round where we had one student place 2nd and one placed 4th. Out of 10 schools, we placed 3rd.
- ♦ Bow Ties Group participated in a Unified Basketball Tournament.
- ♦ DFMS had several District-Level Science Fair Winners:
 - 7th Grade-1st, 2nd & 3rd place winners and 1st, 2nd & 3rd place Honorable Mentions.
 - 8th Grade-1st, 2nd & 3rd place winners and 1st, 2nd & 3rd place Honorable Mentions.
 - DFMS also had a student place 2nd for Physical Science/Chemistry in the District Fair.
- DFMS Student earned numerous awards at this year's SC Region II Science and Engineering Fair held March 22 at the University of South Carolina Booker T. Washington Auditorium.
