Report Card Summary

- 2011 School Report Card Rating : Below Average
- 75% of the sophomore class passed each portion of the HSAP Exam.
- 2011 graduation rate was 76.1%.

Performance Goals

Goal 1: The number of students enrolling in dual credit and advance placement classes in preparation for career readiness will increase by 20 students.

Goal 2: The percentage of tenth grade students in the current school year who meet the standards on both HSAP subtest on the first attempt will increase by 8%.

Goal 3: The percentage of students scoring C or better on EOCEP will increase to 98% by 2016.

Goal 4: The percentage of original ninth grade student who earn a standard high school diploma and graduate in four years will increase 13%.

Goal 5: The percentage of students who qualify for honor classes will increase by 3%.

Goal 6: The percentage of students who receive a school suspension will decrease by 2%.

Academics

- We have a varied and challenging curriculum. Juniors and Seniors may take college level courses through Piedmont Technical College to earn 24 credit hours each year.
- 38% of the students enrolled in dual credit classes with Piedmont Technical College either made the President's or Dean's List.
- English and mathematics classes are taught using the College Board Curriculum Springboard.
- 100% of the Career and Technology completers in Health/Science Technology passed the National Health Care Assessment.
- Advanced placement classes are offered in English and Studio Art 3D.
- We offer supplemental core instruction to provide students additional academic assistance after school.
- Students who are on the A or the A-B Honor Roll are issued Gold/Silver Cards.
