Our School Today

Easterling Primary School serves 827 students: 105 4K students, 245 5K students, 271 first graders, and 206 second graders. The student attendance rate is 95% and is down from 96.4% over the past year. EPS has 58 certified staff members and 38 paraprofessionals. Teachers with advanced degrees make up 48.9% of the faculty. EPS has an average class of 20.5 to 1 student-teacher ratio in core subject areas.
