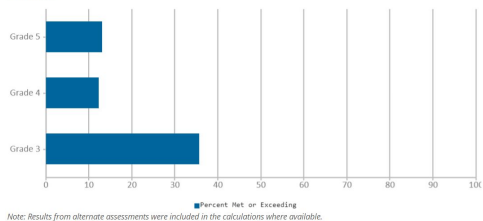

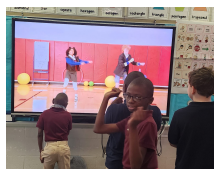


Fifth-grade teachers, along with the guidance and support of our Assistant Administrator, Ms. Davis, utilized Common Planning this week to analyze iReady math data.
