SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

Academics

- *Parent University:* Mini-workshops are conducted by teachers on standards and curriculum, opportunities available to help families, and ways to help their children at home.
- *Hot Dog I Can Read! Night* is a night to promote reading. Parents are invited to school to listen to their child read and share a hot dog. Participating families are given a book to take home.
- *Math Night:* Parents are invited to school where they are engaged in math games and activities that they can use at home with their children.
- *Awards Day (quarterly)* Students are recognized for their academic success, good behavior, and attendance.
- *PTO Meetings and Assembly Programs:* Meetings are held four times a year. Each grade level presented a play or program at PTO meetings.
- *Fun Day (quarterly)* Students are rewarded for good behavior, attendance, and being on time for school.
- *Field Day* is held annually. Students are involved in physical education activities to promote good sportsmanship and fair play.

- *Report Card/Parent Conference Evenings* are held four times a year at the interim of the nine-week periods.
- *Professional Development:* Teachers have worked with consultants on the Rotational Model, understanding Common Core Standards, implementing Common Core Writing Standards and writing assessments with Common Core Standards.
- *Measure of Academic Progress* is administered three times a year to monitor student's progress in Math and ELA and help teachers plan instruction.

School and Community

- *Grandparent's Luncheon* is held each September. Grandparents are invited to join their grandchildren for lunch and visit their classrooms.
- *Doughnuts for Dads* is held each spring. Dads join their children before classes begin for the day for doughnuts and juice.
- *Muffins for Moms* is held each spring. Moms join their children one morning before classes begin for the day for a muffin and juice.
