## About Us...

It is a privilege and a pleasure to inform you of all the great things that are happening at Bennettsville Primary School. It is our aim that each child who enters our doors is offered the most comprehensive educational experience in to order to allow students to develop into great achievers who reach their highest potential. We strived to make this goal a reality by providing all students the optimal environment for learning which includes high time on task, active student engagement, and highly qualified faculty and staff.
Three different instruments are used to collect data and measure student achievement at Bennettsville Primary School. They are: Dial-3 (given to Pre-K students), Dominie (Reading and Writing Assessment for students in Pre-K through 2nd grade), and The MAP (Measures of Academic Performance given to K-2nd grade students). Based on the spring 2013 MAP scores $69 \%$ of Kindergarten Students, 68\% First Grade Students and $70 \%$ of Second Grade Students met their target RIT for ELA. In addition $80 \%$ of Kindergarten, $74 \%$ of Frist Grade Students, and 73\% of Second Grade Students met their Target RIT score in Math. It is our goal for the 2013-2014 school years that $75 \%$ of all of our students meet their Target RIT score in ELA and for $80 \%$ of all of our students to meet their Target RIT score in Math

It is our plan to continue to improve instruction through staff development. On the second and fourth Tuesdays students are dismissed early allowing time for staff development. With an increase in staff development and training for teachers and staff, new teaching strategies help improve reading, writing, mathematics, science, social studies, and financial literacy.
We have enriched our learning environment by adding 18 SMART Boards in classrooms. By upgrading technology in our classrooms we have provided students and teachers with 21st Century Technology and greatly enhanced both teaching and learning. In addition, a plethora of books and materials have been added to classrooms through grants and instructional funding.
We all know that it takes an entire community to properly educate our children. Our students must experience support from their parents, the school professionals, and active business partners in order to achieve success. We have continued to stress the importance of parent involvement and have provided more opportunities for parents to be involved in their child's education Bennettsville Primary School has an active PTO. We also provided training for parents in both ELA and Math skills, distributed parenting materials and students activity magazines, and organized activities such as Math Night and Snuggle Up and Read. The highly qualified faculty and staff continue to work together to improve our success.
