Report to the Parents

Another goal is to raise the academic achievement of all our students through project-based learning, integration of the arts, and utilizing literacy strategies across content areas. We continue to personalize learning through the implementation of new instructional strategies to impact each student's individual learning styles and needs. BIS teachers use a data driven approach to ensure that students' academic needs are being met. Teachers participate in professional development sessions throughout the school year.
