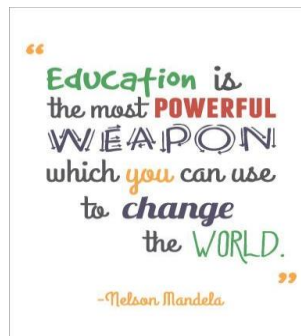

2021-2022 Action Plan

MEMS offers various programs to meet the needs of all students. Kindergarten through fifth grade are self-contained, offering whole group and small group instruction based on the South Carolina College and Career Readiness Standards. Sixth grade through eighth grade are departmentalized. Gifted Education of Marlboro Schools (GEMS) students in grades three through eighth are served in English Language Arts and mathematics. The Pre-Kindergarten curriculum is Good Start Grow Smart early learning standards. Special Education students are served through various staff including occupational therapists, physical therapists, a speech therapist, and special education teachers. Students can receive counseling services through Tri-County Mental Health and dental screenings through CareSouth. We also have a Career Specialist who serves 6th - 8th grade students.

McColl Elementary Middle School will continue to implement:

- Mastery Connect, Fountas and Pinnell, and Accelerated Reader in an effort to motivate students to read, improve their reading comprehension, and advance their reading levels
- Gizmos to improve Science skills
- Differentiated instruction daily to address the needs and learning styles of all students
- Quarterly data meetings to analyze data, set goals, reflect, and foster an environment where data is valued and used to drive instruction
- Weekly Grade-Level PLC meetings to collaborate with teachers on planning and instruction and to focus on student growth and achievement
