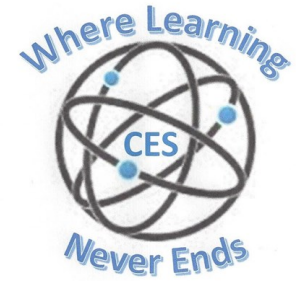

- Grades PK– fifth students are involved in Project Lead the Way Robotics Program
- E3 Lead Teacher creates an approach to help teachers solve problems through discovering, testing, and sharing better practices

COVID-19 Response

When the COVID-19 Pandemic forced the state to suspend school for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year, we immediately sprang into action.

- We quickly ensured that each of our students were issued the necessary technology to ensure that instruction would continue.
- Teachers and staff participated in professional development to include Google Classroom, Simple K-12, SeeSaw and Schoology to better prepare themselves to provide quality virtual instruction.
- The administrators continued to support the instructional program by participating in professional development along with the teachers, leading the efforts to maintain constant contact with our student population by making telephone calls, manning the building and ensuring that the daily operations of the school continued in the best way possible.
- Volunteers packed lunches and assisted with loading them onto schools buses so that our students would be fed.
- The administrators continued to receive guidance from the district via regular Zoom calls with the Superintendent and Senior Cabinet, in which the latest local, state, and federal guidelines were shared in a comprehensive effort to plan for reopening of schools for the 2020-2021 school year.
