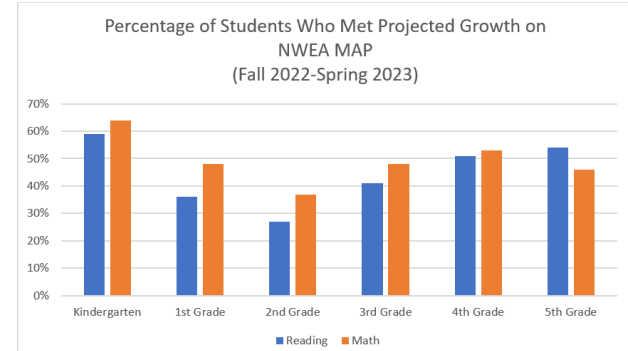
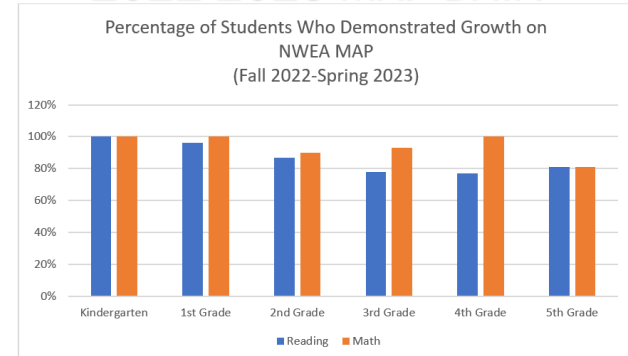


After School Program
