ABOUT US...

Clio Elementary Middle School is a public school serving students in grades Pre-K through 8. There are a total of 215 students enrolled at CEMS this year.

During the 2014-15, our focus has been on increasing student achievement in the areas of Reading and Math. We have fully implemented the Teacher Advancement Program (TAP), which is a whole school reform intended to recruit, motivate, develop and retain high quality teachers. The SC Department of Education sent us a Reading Coach as a part of The Read to Succeed Initiative. The Reading Coach facilitates Balanced Literacy Professional Developments and works directly with teachers and students in grades PreK-5. In addition to the Reading Coach, two new Master

Teachers were added to our staff as well. We continue to partner with our community, parents and Businesses to reach our goal.

ogy, which are used to engage the students in learning. Students are motivated through the use of technology. Our Pre-K and kindergarten classes are engaged in the HATCH program. This year Grades 3-5 adopted a new math curriculum, Go math and Grades 6-8 math program is Digits. Both programs have a strong emphasis on technology. Clio continues to utilize software instructional programs, such as FASTT Math, Fraction Nation, Read 180, and Accelerated Reader. In addition, Along with 21st Century Community Learning Program, two additional afterschool programs were added, PEAK and Academy.

Professional development continues to be a focus of both the schools and the district. The school district continued with Early Release two days a month. Teachers recognize the importance of professional growth. This year, our district has initiated early dismissal twice a month to allow teachers to attend professional development in their subject areas. Teachers are afforded the opportunity to engage in collaborative planning during common planning sessions and with other teachers across the school district.

Clio Elementary Middle School promotes academic excellence by empowering children to set and achieve high standards, develop problemsolving skills, be self-reflective, make responsible decisions and become life long learners.
