


School Improvement Council

After School Program

The afterschool program at Wallace Elementary Middle School provided multiple opportunities for students in grade k-2 to explore media through the Marian Wright Edelman Library each week. In grades 3-8 students were a part of STEM and robotics along with continued support with coding. Students experienced a collaborative culture which represented innovated learning through problem/project-based learning. Activities and instructional strategies were also implemented during the regular school day in all content areas.
