

School Improvement Plan

Performance Goal I: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the Algebra I EOC assessment will increase from 83% in 2022 to 100% in 2027.

Performance Goal II: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the Algebra I EOC assessment will increase from 41% in 2022 to 60% in 2027.

Performance Goal III: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the English II EOC assessment will increase from 88.14% in 2022 to 100% in 2027.

Performance Goal IV: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the English II EOC assessment will increase from 77.19% in 2022 to 100% in 2027.

Performance Goal V: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the Biology EOC assessment will increase from 64% in 2022 to 89% in 2027.

Performance Goal VI: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the Biology EOC assessment will increase from 48% in 2022 to 73% in 2027.

Performance Goal VII: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the US History EOC assessment will increase from 44% in 2022 to 69% in 2027.

Performance Goal VIII: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the US History EOC assessment will increase from 28.54% in 2022 to 53.5% in 2027.

Performance Goal IX: The percentage of students who graduate with a high school diploma with their class will increase from 87.4% in 2022 to 100% in 2027.

Performance Goal X: The percentage of students who graduate in four years who are college and/or career ready will increase from 68.6% in 2022 to 94% in 2027.

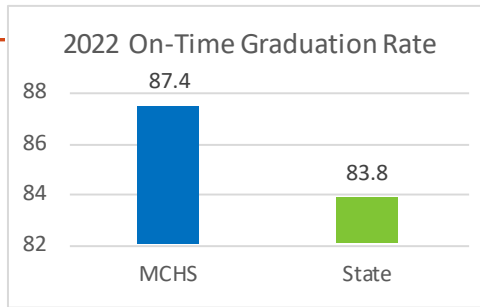
Performance Goal XI: The percentage of ML students who met progress toward proficiency target will increase from 51% in 2022 to 68.5% in 2027.

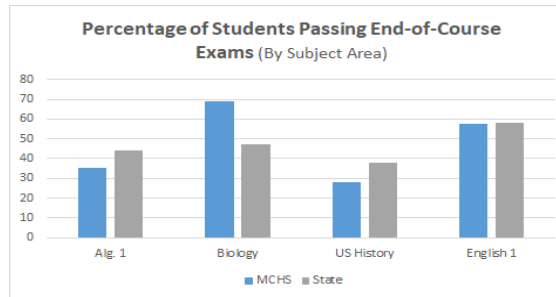
Performance Goal XIII: The percentage of students satisfied with the social and physical environment will increase from 82% in 2022 to 100% in 2027.

2021-2022 & 2022-2023 Awards & Accomplishments

- Scholarship money awarded to seniors totaled \$3,652,945.
- Of 152 graduates, 84 graduates received completer certificates from the Newberry County Career Center, 41 graduates earned a Newberry County Advanced Diploma, 18 graduates were named as Newberry County School District Honor Graduates, 3 graduates earned the South Carolina Academic Honors Award, 25 graduates were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society, graduates earned over 2,371 credit hours for transfer credit towards college degrees, 10 Palmetto Fellows recipients earned a potential scholarship total of \$292,000 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, 46 students earned a 3.0 or better and ranked in the top 30% of their class with a potential LIFE scholarship total of \$920,000 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, 116 students earned a 3.0 or better with a potential LIFE Scholarship total of \$1,160,000 towards a two-year Associates Degree, and 116 students met the 3.0 requirement that qualifies a student for the HOPE scholarship with a potential HOPE scholarship total of \$324,800 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree.
- Two MCHS wrestlers won State Championship titles in their weight class at the State Championship Wrestling Tournament.
- The golf team won the Region 4-AAA Golf Tournament. Five players were named All-Region Golf Players. One player won Region Player of the Year. They finished 10th in the state at the State Golf Tournament.
- The baseball team won the 2022 Region 4-AAA Baseball Championship. Seven players were named Region 4-AAA All-Region Baseball Players. One player won All-State.
- The softball team won the 2022 Region 4-AAA Softball Championship. One player won Region Player of the Year. Four players were named Region 4-AAA All-Region Softball Players.
- The varsity girls' soccer team won the 2022 Region 4-AAA Girls Soccer Championship. One player won Region Player of the Year. Five players were named Region 4-AAA All-Region Girls Soccer Players.
- The 2021-2022 MCHS girls' soccer team earned the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award for exemplary performance in the classroom as a team during the 2021-2022 academic year.
- The varsity boys' soccer team won the 2022 Region 4-AAA Boys Soccer Championship. Four players were named Region 4-AAA All-Region Boys Soccer Players. One player won All-State.
- The boys' tennis team won the 2022 Region 4-AAA Boys Tennis Championship. Three players were named Region 4-AAA All-Region Boys Tennis Players.
- The girls' track team won the 2022 Region 4-AAA Track and Field Championship.
- Envirothon competed with fourteen schools on Soils, Aquatics, Wildlife, Orals, and Forestry. The MCHS Envirothon Team placed 1st in Soils and 3rd in Wildlife and Orals.
- The Music Department hosted a Spring Concert.
- The Art Department held their Annual Art Show celebrating art students hard work, talent, and effort.
- The new MC track facility was officially named in honor of Coach Jackie Harris.
- The Class of 2022 participated in a Senior Walk hosted by the local Elementary Schools.
- MCHS held our first Annual Senior Picnic and College/Military/Career Signing Day for the Class of 2022.
- One MCHS student tied for 3rd place in the state of South Carolina on the Trig-Star Test.
- MCHS Army JROTC Posted the Colors at Newberry's annual Memorial Day Ceremony.
