

School Improvement Plan

Performance Goal I: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the Algebra I EOC assessment will increase from 83% in 2022 to 100% in 2028.

Performance Goal II: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the Algebra I EOC assessment will increase from 41% in 2022 to 60% in 2028.

Performance Goal III: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the English II EOC assessment will increase from 88.14% in 2022 to 100% in 2028.

Performance Goal IV: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the English II EOC assessment will increase from 77.19% in 2022 to 100% in 2028.

Performance Goal V: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the Biology EOC assessment will increase from 64% in 2022 to 89% in 2028.

Performance Goal VI: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the Biology EOC assessment will increase from 48% in 2022 to 73% in 2028.

Performance Goal VII: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the US History EOC assessment will increase from 44% in 2022 to 69% in 2028.

Performance Goal VIII: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the US History EOC assessment will increase from 28.54% in 2022 to 53.5% in 2028.

Performance Goal IX: The percentage of students who graduate with a high school diploma with their class will increase from 87.4% in 2022 to 100% in 2028.

Performance Goal X: The percentage of students who graduate in four years who are college and/or career ready will increase from 68.6% in 2022 to 94% in 2028.

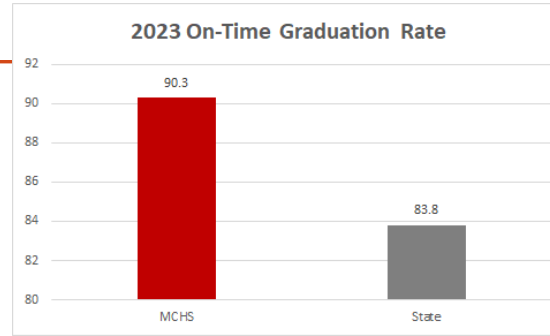
Performance Goal XI: The percentage of ML students who met progress toward proficiency target will increase from 51% in 2022 to 68.5% in 2028.

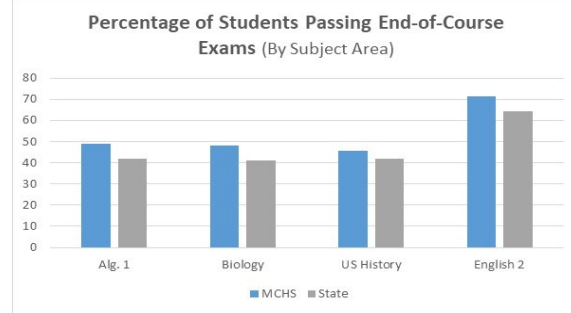
Performance Goal XIII: The percentage of students satisfied with the social and physical environment will increase from 82% in 2022 to 100% in 2028.

2022-2023 & 2023-2024 Awards & Accomplishments

- Scholarship money awarded to seniors totaled \$3,510,204.
- Of 181 graduates, 108 graduates received completer certificates from the Newberry County Career Center, 28 graduates earned a Newberry County Advanced Diploma, 11 graduates were named as Newberry County School District Honor Graduates, 3 graduates earned the South Carolina Academic Honors Award, 37 graduates were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society, graduates earned over 2,580 credit hours for transfer credit towards college degrees, 8 Palmetto Fellows recipients earned a potential scholarship total of \$233,600 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, 53 students earned a 3.0 or better and ranked in the top 30% of their class with a potential LIFE scholarship total of \$1,060,000 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, 138 students earned a 3.0 or better with a potential LIFE Scholarship total of \$1,380,000 towards a two-year Associates Degree, and 138 students met the 3.0 requirement that qualifies a student for the HOPE scholarship with a potential HOPE scholarship total of \$386,400 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree.
- The band program was recognized by the SC Band Director's Association with the 2023 Outstanding Performance Award.
- Four students attended and competed at the SC Economics Challenge placing 2nd.
- Three JROTC Cadets participated in JROTC Day at the SC State House.
- Four MCHS seniors participated in the SC Department of Education's Military Honor Cords and State Recognition event.
- Nineteen MCHS students were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society during the Spring 2023 Induction Ceremony.
- Students and counselors visited Piedmont Technical College for PTC's Open House to explore the PTC program majors and view the Greenwood campus.
- Three seniors were named as members of the 2023 SC Teaching Fellows cohort.
- Fifteen student athletes signed a national letter of intent during the 2022-2023 school year to play in their prospective sport: three cheer – Newberry College; two track—Newberry College; cross country and track – College of Charleston; baseball – Newberry College; baseball – USC Sumter; baseball—Erskine College; softball – North Greenville University; softball – Coker College; two softball – USC Union; two football – Newberry College.
- Athletic Director and Head Football Coach was selected to coach in the North/South Football game.
- Head softball coach was named 2023 Softball Coach of the Year by the SCACA Board of Directors.
- Varsity girls soccer team won their third consecutive region title. Four members were selected as All-Region II-AA and two members were selected as All-State.
- Four boys' soccer team members were selected as All-Region II-AA.
- Two boys' tennis players were selected as All-Region II-AA.
- The girls' track team won the Region II-AA Championship. Ten girls were selected as All-Region II-AA with two selected as All-State.
- The boy's track team were Region II-AA Runner-Up. Two boys were selected as All-Region II-AA with one selected as All-State.
- One golf team member was named the Region II-AA Player of the Year.
- The baseball team won the 2023 District Championship. Eight players were selected All-Region II-AA. Three players were selected All-State.
- The softball team won the 2023 Region II-AA Softball Championship and went on to claim the II-AA State Runner-up position. Five players were named Region II-AA All-Region Softball Players.
- The 2022-2023 MCHS girls' soccer team earned the following awards: High School Team Academic Award, United Soccer Coaches Spring High School Team Ethics and Sportsmanship Award, and United Soccer Coaches Pinnacle Award.
