Interim Performance Goal VII: The percentage of students who graduate with a high school diploma with their class will increase from 87.3% in 2015 to 92.5% in 2016.



2014-2015 & 2015-2016 Awards & Accomplishments

- Scholarship money awarded to seniors totaled \$2,457,400.
- Of 175 graduates, 68 graduates received completer certificates from the Newberry County Career Center, 115 graduates earned a Newberry County Advanced Diploma, 10 graduates were named as Newberry County School District Honor Graduates, graduates earned a total of 1041 dual credit hours for transfer credit towards college degrees, 6 Palmetto Fellows recipients earned a potential scholarship total of \$87,600 per year towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, 51 students earned a 3.0 or better and ranked in the top 30% of their class with a potential LIFE scholarship total of \$255,000 per year towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, and 56 students met the 3.0 requirement that qualifies a student for the HOPE scholarship with a potential HOPE scholarship total of \$148,400 per year towards a four year Bachelor's Degree.
- Progress recognized in the 2015 Annual School Report Card marks MCHS as one of the top academic achieving schools in South Carolina.
- MCHS is a Palmetto Gold Award winner.
- The Newberry Soil & Water Conservation District constructed an outdoor classroom to be used by our students and faculty/ staff
- One student scored a 35 overall composite score on the ACT.
- Four MCHS students received their State FFA Degree at the State FFA Convention during the summer of 2015.
- Four MCHS students received their national certification in Health Science.
- The MCHS recycling program recycled 3,412 pounds of paper during the 2014-2015 school year.
- MCHS Guidance Department and Link Crew hosted its 8th Annual Freshmen Orientation.
- College Fair (Ed-Op) was held for juniors and seniors. Around 44 colleges/university attended the fair to share valuable information with our students.
- MCHS hosted Career Quest several times throughout the 2015-2016 school year.
