Performance Goal XI: The percentage of students satisfied with the learning environment will increase from an average of 68.8% in 2017 to 75.3% in 2023


Performance Goal XII: The percentage of students satisfied with the social and physical environment will increase from 72% in 2017 to 81% in 2023.


Performance Goal XIII: The percentage of parents who feel welcome at MCHS will be maintained from 96.46% in 2017 to 97.71% in 2023.

2017-2018 & 2018-2019 Awards & Accomplishments

- Scholarship money awarded to seniors totaled \$2,500,951.00.
- Of 172 graduates, 96 graduates received completer certificates from the Newberry County Career Center, 81 graduates earned a Newberry County Advanced Diploma, 15 graduates were named as Newberry County School District Honor Graduates, 5 graduates earned the South Carolina Academic Honors Award, 22 graduates were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society, graduates earned a total of 612 dual credit hours for transfer credit towards college degrees, 9 Palmetto Fellows recipients earned a potential scholarship total of \$262,800 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, 42 students earned a 3.0 or better and ranked in the top 30% of their class with a potential LIFE scholarship total of \$440,000 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, and 71 students met the 3.0 requirement that gualifies a student for the HOPE scholarship with a potential HOPE scholarship total of \$795,200 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree.
- A teacher was awarded the Newberry County Reading Council's Distinguished Literacy High School Teacher of the Year Award. An assistant principal was awarded the Newberry County Reading Council's Distinguished Literacy Administrator of the Year Award.
