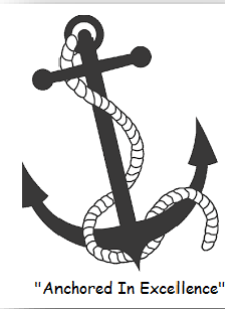


Mission Statement

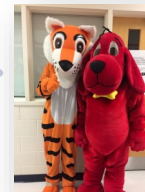
