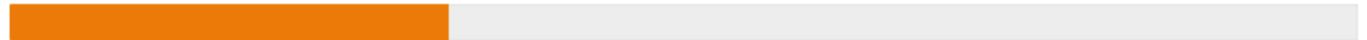

English Language Arts (Reading and Writing) - [Percent Met or Exceeding](#)

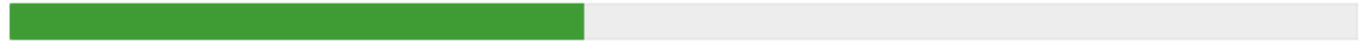

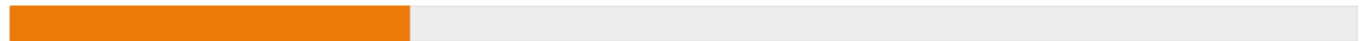

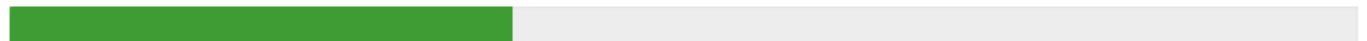

HIGHLIGHTS OF SCHOOL YEAR

- Breakfast in the Classroom provides breakfast for every child each morning.
- LME highlights students each month who demonstrate leadership by exemplifying one of the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People.
- Countdown to Kindergarten.
- Archery Team won 3rd Place in the State.
- \$7,291.68 raised for the American Heart Association. Almost a 700% increase from last school year.
- Wildcats collected 2,432 nonperishable food items for our local food pantry. This doubled the amount of items brought in during the 2020-2021 school year.
- Wildcats work together as a team to earn loops for displaying various leadership abilities. Classes are rewarded as they receive numerical milestones.
- WLME is broadcast live each morning. 5th grade students apply and are chosen to hosts this morning news show.
- Reading Recovery
- Our 5th graders presented a wax museum in April.
- Our school has one math interventionist and two reading interventionist.
- Our students celebrated Read Across America Week with an amazing Character Book Parade.
- Kids in Lids fundraiser brought in \$382.01 for children with cancer.
- An After School Academic program was offered to students in grades 3-5.
- Gifted and Talented chorus students Performed for the Town of Little Mountain at Christmas.
- Friday dance parties during morning arrival to build community and positive school environment.

COVID-19 changed many procedural systems for our school and prohibited us from hosting student performances and face to face meetings in the Fall, but it did not change the commitment of our school family, SIC and PTO to working together in providing a strong foundation of leadership and learning for children.
