Student performance has been assessed and analyzed using iReady, Open Court and SCREADY. Students' ELA scores continue to improve as foundational skills are explicitly taught through the Open Court Curriculum. Teachers have undergone extensive training in LETRS. These skills and strategies have helped inspire and equip teachers with tools and resources to engage students in early literacy skills and instructional strategies.

Through the use of Math Interventionist, we have been able to target learning gaps and address math deficiencies. New Math curriculum will be implemented in the 2025-26 school year that will better align with the 2025 Math standards. Professional Development relating to technology, instructional strategies, and social / emotional development will be a focal point for faculty and staff this year to maximize instruction. We believe this will afford opportunities to increase student achievement by providing effective strategies that will equip our students for an ever-changing society.

According to parent and teacher surveys, 80.0% believe our school needs to continue working on homeschool relations. With this in mind, we will continue to strive to offer school wide events and volunteering opportunities for families throughout the school year.
