Newberry Elementary has 460 students. The population is as follows: 59.0% African American, 11.9% Caucasian, 27.6% Hispanic and 1.5% other races. The mission of Newberry Elementary School is to equip and empower the whole child to meet the challenges and opportunities of the 21st Century.

Student performance has been assessed and analyzed using I Ready, Fountas and Pinnell and SCREADY. Students at Newberry Elementary School have previously scored higher in math than English Language Arts. However, ELA has improved during recent testing.

Visual tools for learning, and visual patterns linked to specific cognitive processes and Reading Recovery have been implemented.

Early Childhood teachers have undergone extensive training in LETRS. These skills and strategies have helped inspire and equip teachers with tools and resources to engage students in early literacy skills and instructional strategies. All ELA classrooms have received the Open Court curriculum and teachers have utilized the targeted bands to meet the needs of our students.

Professional Development relating to technology, instructional strategies, and social / emotional development will be a focal point for faculty and staff this year to maximize instruction. We believe this will afford opportunities to increase student achievement by providing effective strategies that will equip our students for an ever-changing society.

According to parent and teacher surveys, 80.0% believe our school needs to continue working on home-school relations. With this in mind, we will continue to strive to offer school wide events and volunteering opportunities for families throughout the school year.

We understand society has changed and families are extremely busy outside of school. We will utilize a variety of methods of communication to advertise volunteering opportunities and ways to engage in our school wide events. Platforms such as Thrill Share and social media will be used to ensure families are well-informed and aware of events and/or meetings to be active participants. We will continue to build trusting relationships within our building and welcome parents into our school in a variety of ways.
