
Prosperity-Rikard Elementary School is part of the School District of Newberry County. The school is located in the Town of Prosperity, a rural area of Newberry County. The school opened in the winter of 1997 and serves students in grades Pre-K - 5.

The school has a principal and an assistant administrator, twenty-five certified teachers (four of which are National Board Certified Teachers, two have been the District Teacher of the Year, and one has been the State Teacher of the Year), five instructional assistants, five cafeteria staff, and three custodial staff members. We are fortunate to have a full time nurse, guidance counselor, media specialist, art, music, computer, and physical education teachers, and two speech language pathologists. We provide ESOL services with a certified teacher. Our campus also houses a Developmentally Delayed Preschool Classroom and a multi-categorical LD/SC classroom. Our front office staff consists of two secretaries. The 370 children attending Prosperity-Rikard come from various socio-economic levels.

Prosperity-Rikard Elementary School provides a positive, pleasant, and safe learning environment for students in grades K-5. Teachers provide challenging learning experiences and employ a variety of teaching strategies to meet the needs of all students.


