#### 2018-2019 Programs and Initiatives:

#### ♦ 1:1 Student Chromebooks

This was our first year implementing the 1:1 Initiative where every student received a Chromebook. Chromebooks were used in every classroom to supplement instruction.

#### WAR Class (Advisement Period)

We have continued to include a daily 30-minute advisement period where students' educational experiences are enriched through Silent Sustained Reading (SSR), academic advisement, and character education.

#### Extra Help (Enrichment Time)

Students are afforded the opportunity to receive additional assistance from their teachers outside of normal instruction. Students can work on assignments or gain further instruction before school, during lunch, and after school.
