

#### JMB's Goals

#### **Student Achievement: Performance Goal**

By 2012, 90% of the students in grades 3-5 participating in state-wide testing will score met or exemplary on PASS.

#### **Progress Achieved:**

#### I. ELA, Math, Science, & Social Studies -

Teachers are currently receiving professional development to implement new Commom Core State Standards into instruction. Teachers analyze test data (PASS, MAP, & benchmark assessments) to determine remediation opportunities for students. Our Assistant Principal for Instruction, Literacy Coach, and Math Coach provide professional development for teachers to assist them with reading, writing, and math.

II. Student Remediation - JMB continues to excel in providing Interventions in reading and math for our students. This year, each grade level has an interventionist that works with their grade level. This individual works with students in the area of reading and math.

We continue to offer interventions in the following areas: *Early Reading Intervention (ERI)* to support at-risk students in Kindergarten; *Reading Recovery* to support at-risk 1st grade students and *SOAR* to support students in grades 3-5.

Through Supplemental Educational Services (SES), eligible JMB students are provided free after school tutoring services. Students are given a pretest to determine their area of need. Students are given a posttest to determine their growth at the end of the program.
