James M. Brown Elementary continues to review, revise, and improve our school plan in order to strive for excellence. For the 2015-2016 school year, the following are implemented:

Literacy in all classrooms – We continue to emphasize literacy in all classrooms. We provide ongoing professional development on strategies and resources on programs such as Fountas and Pinnell, The Daily Five, The Café Book, High Progress Literacy strategies, guided reading, small group instruction, and John Collins Thinking and Writing Program.

<u>Using data to drive instruction</u> – We continue to analyze and utilize data from school-wide, district-wide, and state-wide assessments such as SC READY, PASS, MAP, and other various classroom and school level programs.

Implementing Technology - We continue to utilize technology as an instructional tool by purchasing iPads, Chromebooks, laptops, student desktops, and other various technology items for classrooms.

Interventions and Enrichment—We continue to provide an intervention teacher at each grade level to work with students in the area of reading and math. In addition, all students receive an enrichment period during the school day to further individualize instruction.

STEM Instruction—We provide specialized instruction in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics through a STEM lab in grades 3, 4, and 5 and in classrooms K-5.
