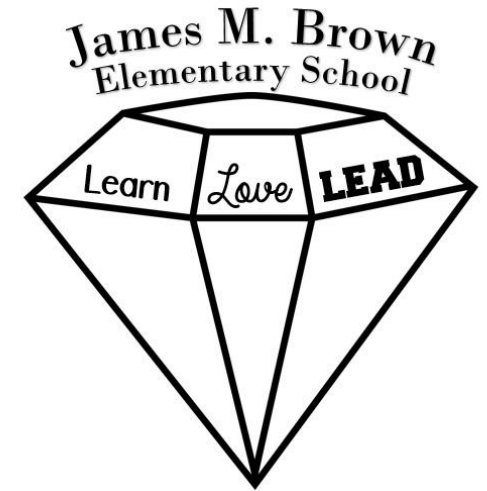
We believe that...

JMB Curricular Goals

James M. Brown Elementary continues to review, revise, and improve our school plan in order to strive for excellence. The following are key areas of focus and implementation for us:

Literacy in all classrooms - We continue to emphasize best-practices in literacy in every classroom. We provide ongoing professional development on instructional strategies and resources such as Fountas and Pinnell Classroom, Heggerty Phonemic Awareness, guided reading, small group instruction, and John Collins Thinking and Writing Program.

Using data to drive instruction - We continue to analyze and utilize data from school, district, and state assessments such as SC READY, PASS, MAP, FastBridge, and other various classroom and school level programs. We also provide ongoing professional development on leveraging the data to maximize our teaching.

Implementing Technology - We continue to utilize technology as an instructional tool by purchasing Chromebooks, interactive panels, and other various technology items for classrooms and student learning.

Interventions and Enrichment - We continue to provide intervention and enrichment resources for teachers to use with students in the areas of reading and math. We have an Accelerator Coach and a Reading Coach on campus to help support teachers in implementing interventions in the classroom. In addition, all students receive an enrichment period during the school day to further individualize instruction.
