

## JMB Curricular Goals

James M. Brown Elementary continues to review, revise, and improve our school plan in order to strive for excellence. The following are key areas of focus and implementation for us this year:

Literacy in all classrooms - We continue to emphasize literacy in all classrooms. We provide ongoing professional development on strategies and resources on programs such as Fountas and Pinnell, The Daily Five, The Café Book, guided reading, small group instruction, and John Collins Thinking and Writing Program.

<u>Using data to drive instruction</u> - We continue to analyze and utilize data from school, district, and state assessments such as SC READY, PASS, MAP, and other various classroom and school level programs.

<u>Implementing Technology</u> - We continue to utilize technology as an instructional tool by purchasing Chromebooks, laptops, interactive panels, and other various technology items for classrooms and student learning.

<u>Interventions and Enrichment</u> - We continue to provide intervention teachers to work with students in the areas of reading and math. In addition, all students receive an enrichment period during the school day to further individualize instruction.

<u>Spanish</u> – All students in PreK-5th grade receive at least one day of Spanish instruction for 45 minutes from a Spanish certified teacher.
