IN 1996, Fair Play and Oakway Elementary merged to become Fair-Oak Elementary. Due to overcrowding at the facility and the merger of Oakway and Westminster Middle Schools into West Oak Middle, 4th and 5th graders moved to the former Oakway Middle School in 2007. Oakway and Fair-Oak operated as two separate identities for 8 years. In 2015-2016, Fair-Oak once again became one school, but separate campuses. In 2016-2017, Fair-Oak was opened as one school in a modern, renovated facility.
