SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Orangeburg-Calhoun Tech (OC Tech)

Early College

The OC Tech Early College blends high school and the first two years of college into one seamless program of study. Students travel to OC Tech during the school day to take college level courses. Early College coursework may be used for high school majors, complimentary coursework, or general education courses, including university transfer. The OC Tech Early College provides students with the opportunity to graduate from high school with earned college credit to use at OC Tech or other two and four-year colleges and universities.

Orangeburg Advanced College (OAC)

OAC is Orangeburg County School District and OC Tech's combined High School Diploma and Associate Degree Program. The first cohort started in the 2021—2022 school year. The 2024—2025 School Year will begin with Cohort 4.

Junior Reserved Officers' Training Corps (JROTC)

The JROTC Program/Class is available to all students, grades 9—12. Students are offered the opportunity to engage in drill and ceremony, physical training, nursing home visits, highway cleanup, and various other community service programs. The program is not design to encourage military participation, but it does offer great opportunity for students who desire military entry.



Special Programs

Career and Technology Center (CATE)

A positive way to improve student achievement is to provide relevant contexts for studying and learning. LMTC offers 13 out of the 16 Career Clusters. Career clusters link school-based learning with the knowledge and skills required for success in the workplace.

Freshman Academy

The Freshman Academy is a freshman transition program designed for all first-time 9th grade students. Each freshman is scheduled with a Freshman Academy Team Member in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

Jobs for America 's Graduates (JAG)

The JAG model is a statewide dropout prevention and workforce preparation program for youth. The objective of the JAG program is to help youth secure a quality job that will lead to a good career. The LMHS JAG program is one of the best in the state.
