Team E.D.I.S.T.O.

- Engagement**
 - In October, Edisto High School in conjunction with our SIC and Student Council hosted our first annual Trick or Treat Lane. Over 400 students in our feeder schools received candy and participated in Halloween themed games.
 - In December, Edisto High School in conjunction with our SIC hosted our first annual Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony. Activities included: making your own reindeer food, an essay contest, caroling, band and choral performances.
 - Student Council collected money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society.
- Determination**
 - Simson L. Gordon, of Edisto High, joined other outstanding high school students from across the nation in attending a unique academic and career oriented development experience, Envision Game and Technology Academy at George Mason University located in Fairfax, Virginia.
 - Student Council collected over 500 canned food items in November to help stock local food pantries for Thanksgiving.

Key Performance Indicators and Academic Highlights

SC SCHOOL REPORT CARD



- The number of students scoring a C or better in the English I, Biology I and US History EOC's are above the district average.
- 15% of students taking the Biology I EOC scored an A.
- Four-Year Graduation Rate increased 3% percent to 78% overall.
- 70% of seniors were deemed college or career ready.
- 30% of seniors qualified for Life or Palmettos Fellows Scholarship.
- 67% of seniors enrolled in a 2 or 4 year college or technical school.
- 11th grade ACT Composite, English, Math, Reading, and Science scores are above the district average.
- The number of students who received Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze in the National Career Readiness Certificate are all above the district average.
- 90% of juniors and seniors completed 6 hours of dual credit with a grade of C or better.
- 100% of students are served by 1:1 Chromebook personalized learning.

SMART Goals 2018-2019



- All students will demonstrate growth in Reading Informational Text as measured by their performance on the Reading USA Test Prep Assessment pretest and post-test by June 2019.
- The percentage of C students will move from 24% to 29% when they take the EOC in May 2019.
- The percentage of Biology students scoring C or better will increase by 5% when they take the EOC in May 2019.
- The percentage of US History students scoring proficient or higher in US History/Constitution EOC will increase from 32% to 40% by the end of second semester as measured by the EOC administered prior to the end of the school year in June 2019.
- The percentage of students scoring proficient or higher in College Readiness will increase from 25% to 30% by the end of June 2019 as measured by the ACT administered on April 13, 2019.
- The percentage of student graduating on time will increase from 78.20% to 81% by the end of the 2018-2019 school year as measured by graduation rate released in November of 2019.
- The percentage parents that report "My child's teachers and school staff prevent or stop bullying at school", will increase from 38.90% to 60% by the end of the 2018-2019 school year as measured by SC School Report Card administered in May 2019.
- The percentage of juniors participating in the Student Survey will increase from 74.4% to at least 80% by the end of the 2018-2019 school year as measured by SC School Report Card administered in May 2019.

Next Gen Magnet

- The vision of the Next Gen Magnet program is to provide an advanced, enriched curriculum that will prepare all students for college, careers, and life in an ever-changing global economy.
- Freshmen students complete a cross-curriculum Project-Based Learning assessment. The PBL is always based on a local, real-life problem. This year, Freshmen Next Gen students investigated possible pollutants to the Edisto River and created a county-wide report card on the things local businesses were doing to keep our water clean and safe.
- As part of their PBL, Clemson University and The Soil and Water Conversation sponsored the Freshmen attending the 2018 SC Water Conference where they interacted with many different professionals in the water, science, and farming fields discussing water usage across the state.
- This past Fall, Sophomore Next Gen students completed 30 hours of Job Shadowing, following professionals in up to 3 career fields the students were interested in studying. During the Spring semester, students researched their fields of interest further and created an action plan for entering their chosen career.
- As the program continues to grow, Next Gen students will also have opportunities to participate in internships and take college-level classes in their anticipated fields of studies.
