The purpose of the Edisto Primary School (EPS) and Edisto Elementary (EES) Improvement Council is to assist in the development, implementation and evaluation of school's five year plan (also known as the school renewal plan or strategic plan); assist in the preparation of each school's yearly plan updates; write an annual Report to Parents; in conjunction with the principals, prepare the annual narrative for the annual S.C. School Report Card; provide advice on the use of school incentive award expenditures if allocated by the State Legislature and awarded by the school; serve as liaison between schools, schools' organizations, the community and the local school board by collecting and disseminating pertinent information; assisting schools with traffic safety concerns with installation of crosswalks and additional speed bumps and monitoring drop-off/pick-up process; provide other assistance that principals may request as well as carrying out any other duties prescribed the local school board.
