SIC Annual Goals

1. The number of students in grades kindergarten through 5th grade older than usual for designated grade level will decrease from 6.40% in March 2022 to 3.20% by May 2027, as measured by grade retention data in PowerSchool.
2. The percentage of parents indicating satisfaction with the school's effort to communicate important information as measured by state survey (April 2021) will increase from 83.60% in April 2021 to 90% in April 2027.
3. The percentage of students in second grade meeting or exceeding state standards on the MAP reading assessment will increase from 30.6% in 2022 (winter) to 60.00% in spring 2027.
4. The percentage of students in grades 3-5 meeting or exceeding state standardized ELA assessments will increase from 37.25% in spring 2021 to 60.00% by spring 2027.
5. The percentage of students in grades 3-5 meeting or exceeding state standardized math assessment will increase from 27.45% in spring 2021 to 60.00% by spring 2027.
6. The percentage of students in kindergarten demonstrating readiness on Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA) will increase from 47.62% in 2021 to 60.00% by spring 2027.
7. The percentage of students in 4th grade meeting or exceeding state standards on the SC PASS science assessment will increase from 50% (2021 scores) to 65% by spring 2027.
8. By 2027, the teacher attendance rate will increase by 1% annually from 92.9% in 2021 to 97% in 2027.
