

## Townville Elementary School

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## SIC Report to the People 2015-2016

- Townville is a Title I School. Funds from Title I assist in providing additional instructional staff, instructional resources, technology enhancement, and educational opportunities.
- Townville is immersed in technology with support from our district administrative staff. Our students and staff
  have the use of digital cameras, mobile labs with laptops, smartboards in all classrooms, a fixed computer lab, and
  iPads. Our third and fourth graders have all been issued chromebooks in our "1 to World" Initiative to use at
  school. Our fifth and sixth grade students have all been issued chromebooks in our "1 to World" Initiative to use
  at school and at home.
- Townville is a Title I Reward School.
- Townville earned a Palmetto Gold Award from the State Department of Education.
- Enrichment Time All students receive enrichment during a 50-minute block of time each day. These blocks of time are staggered among grade levels and are designed to enhance academic acceleration, academic intervention, and fine art opportunities.
- Administered MAP testing to 5K and 1<sup>St</sup> grade students to better assess current levels and inform their reading and math instruction.
- Second through sixth grade students took MAP tests, along with other assessments, to demonstrate current
  achievement levels and inform instruction in reading, ELA, and math.
- Students who qualify for additional reading services are served in the LLI program.
- SC Therapy Dogs and their trainers work with reluctant readers to allow time to practice reading skills and increase reading fluency and comprehension.
- Michelin Challenge Education program continued its seventh year at Townville Elementary School. Through this
  partnership 30 + employees volunteer time at our school each week. Michelin mentors meet with mentees each
  week to foster relationships which encourage students to share their goals, plans, and ways to improve achievement
  and behavior. Tutors work, at the direction of the teacher, to increase specific skills in content areas.
   Culminating activity is planned for mentors and mentees at year's end.
- The Accelerated Reader Program and Celebrations- Each grade level has a point goal, along with a percentage, to

- meet by the end of every 9 week period. When they reach their goals, qualifying students participate in an AR celebration.
- Our PTO sponsors motivating nine week celebrations are held for students who meet the achievement and school work habits eligibility.
- GoalPOST Before and After School Activities In a partnership with Clemson University, students in grades 3-6
  are provided extra assistance with homework, math, reading instruction and recreation activity.
  Students are eligible based on needs.
- Community groups request use of facilities during the school year including Good News Club, Townville Recreation Department, and Oakdale Baptist's summer sports camp.
- During the Christmas season our school partners with local churches to provide needed clothing, food items, and
  donated toys to underserved families. These same churches provide backpacks and school supplies at the
  beginning of the school year to those in need.
- One church's women's group provides backpacks each Friday to provide food for the weekend to those with need.
- Character Education Program Each month a different character trait is introduced through classroom guidance
  and reinforced by all staff. At a ceremony each month, classroom teachers select a student who exhibits that
  trait in an exemplary manner. The teacher writes a summary of why that student was chosen and it is read in front
  of student body.
- Along with a character trait recognition programs, TES highlights students each month who exemplify one of the 7
   Habits of Highly Effective People which demonstrate leadership.
- Olweus Bully Prevention Program This is a comprehensive, school-wide approach that addresses bullying and
  creates a safer, more positive place to learn. Olweus focuses on improving relationships among all of our students.
  Components include identifying bullying behavior, proper response and reporting of bullying behavior, and class
  meetings. Anti-bullying rules are posted throughout the school.
- Archery in PE and Afterschool Students continued to perfect their skills with the bow and arrow and had the
  opportunity to once again compete with other students across the state. We have three 6<sup>th</sup> grade students
  who will compete in the national competition at the middle school level.
- Family Nights Offered by each grade level so that parents can share in what is happening at school and discover
  ways to assist their children at home with reading, math, science, and social studies.
- STEM activities Our teachers are focusing on ways to integrate activities and projects that require crosscurricular knowledge and collaboration.
- Training for staff given based on Stephen Covey's 7 Habits of Effective Leaders. "Leader in Me" program continues in all grade levels. Our school's theme is leadership.
- Field trips are supported to some degree with Title I funds for transportation and admission costs so that all students have the field experience. We have started participating in on-site "field trips" this year which are based on content standards and focus on hands-on learning.
- Our school hosts summer library hours for students, families, and communities. Students and families can spend time in our library doing research, using computers, and checking out books to read.
