The 2022-2023 school year has been one of increasing student academic achievement and fostering a growth mindset at Sheridan Elementary School. We have a total of 496 students, of which 4 % of the population are English Second Language Learners and 10 % are students' special needs.

Our instructional predictive summative assessment this year, changed from NWEA MAP to iReady Reading and Math assessment. The percentage of students who scored on or above grade level on the iReady reading assessment increased from 12% to 34% and the number of students who scored on grade level or above on the iReady math assessment increased from 1% to 25%. The percentage of students who scored two or more grades level below in reading decreased from 47% to 23% and the percentage of students who were two or more grades level below in math decreased from 52% to 23%.


To improve student academic achievement, we adopted Kagan's growth mindset strategies which are based on the belief that with effort, intelligence can be increased. Students were introduced to new strategies each month, and teachers reinforced and reviewed them daily. Growth mindset was also promoted each day during the morning announcements through the use of quotes and positive language.

Our main goal at Sheridan Elementary is to help all students to develop the world-class knowledge, world-class skills, and life and career characteristics as outlined in the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. We believe that with teachers, students, parents, administrators, community members, and business partners working together, in a safe and positive school environment, we can ensure all students discover and develop their person, purpose, and platform through high-quality educational experiences.

Our learning opportunities for the students here a Sheridan consist of the following:

- (1) 1: 1 iPads for students in grades Pre- Kindergarten through Second Grades and 1:1 Chromebooks for students in grades Third through Fifth.
- (2) Letterland is used as a Reading intervention support program
- (3) All classrooms are equipped with Cleartouch boards and OWL camera devices.
- (4) Use of Mastery Connect and iReady reading and math assessments for formative and summative assessments.
- (5) Small group intervention instruction in ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
- (6) FOSS kits are used as part of our school science program.

Student learning is enhanced through the use of Professional Learning Communities (PLC's), which consist of weekly reviews of student work, student achievement data analysis, implementation of effective instructional practices, and reviews of current research. This year we partnered with NIET (National Institute for Excellent in Teaching) to improve Tier One



instruction. Our community projects this year included a clothing drive with our local homeless shelter and a food drive with a local church.

Our teachers, staff, administrators, PTO, SIC, business partners and community members work together to meet the academic, social, emotional and physical needs of our students. We at Sheridan are committed to providing our students with a high quality education that will allow them to develop into well rounded, productive citizens that are able to compete in a global society.

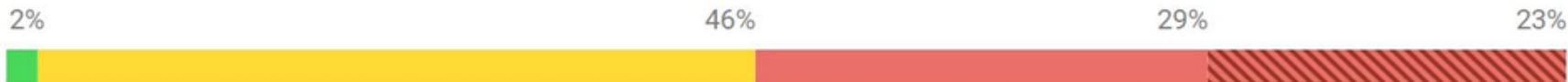

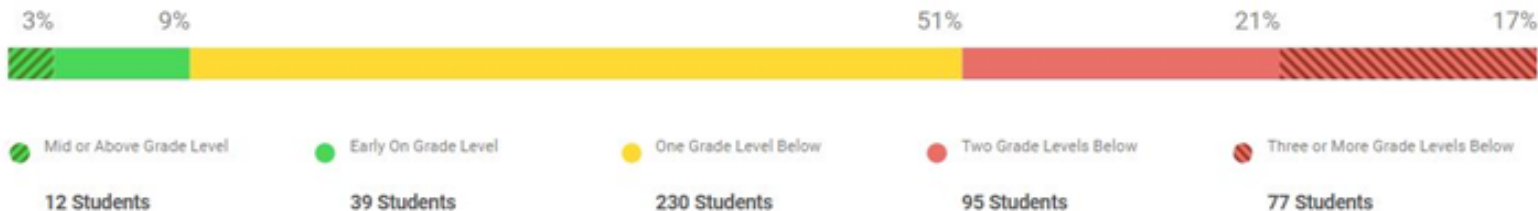

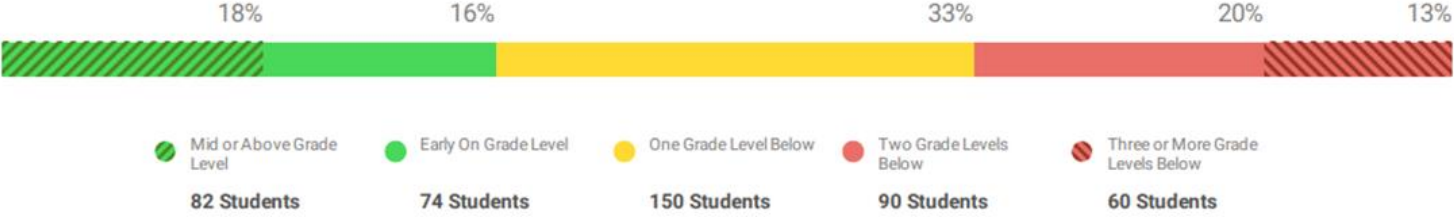

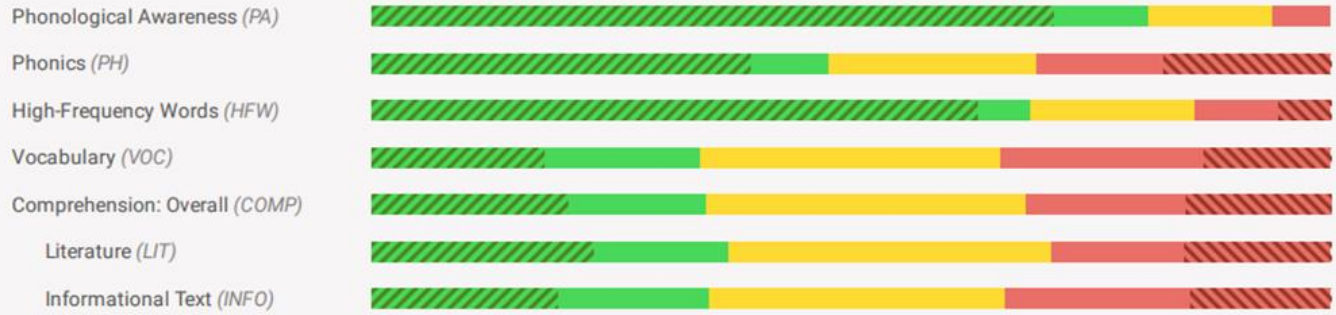

Placement by Domain

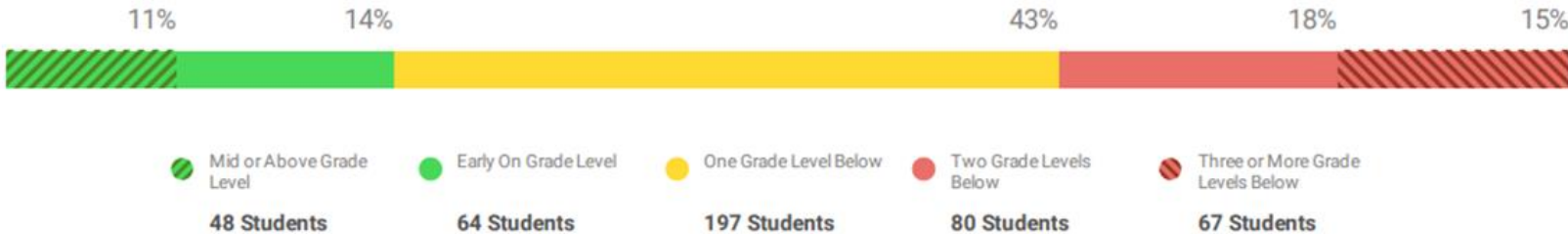

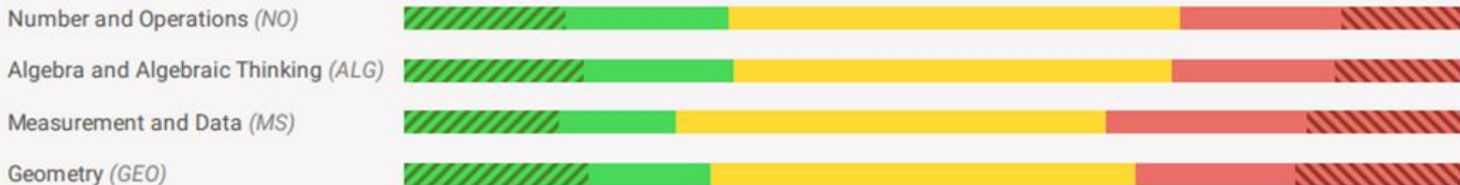

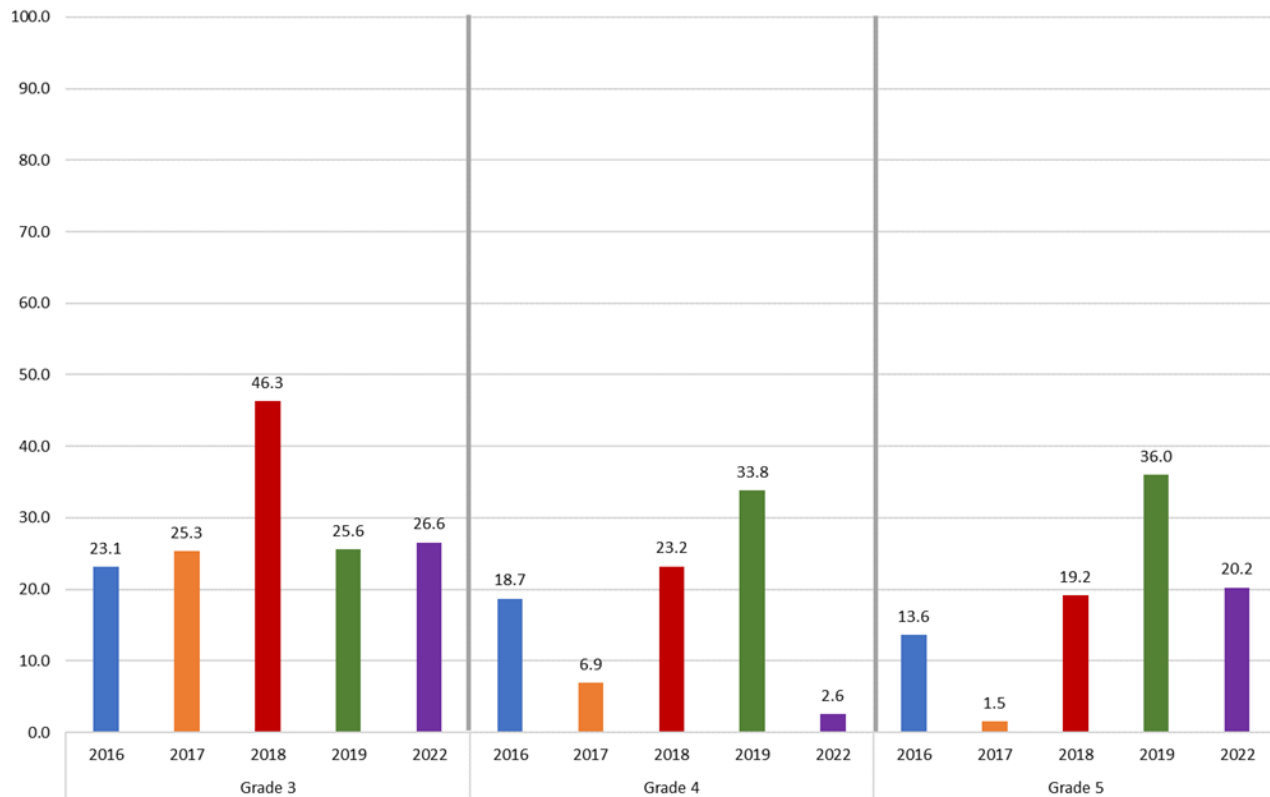

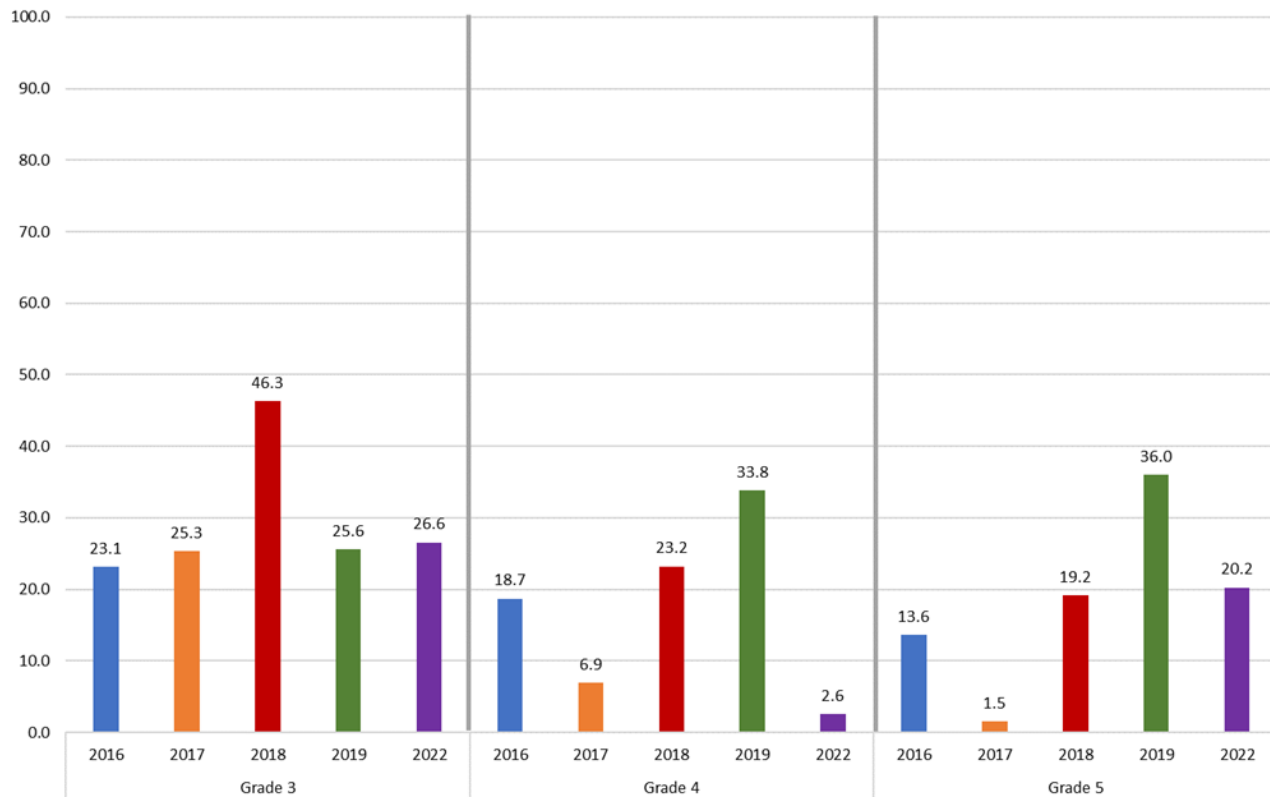

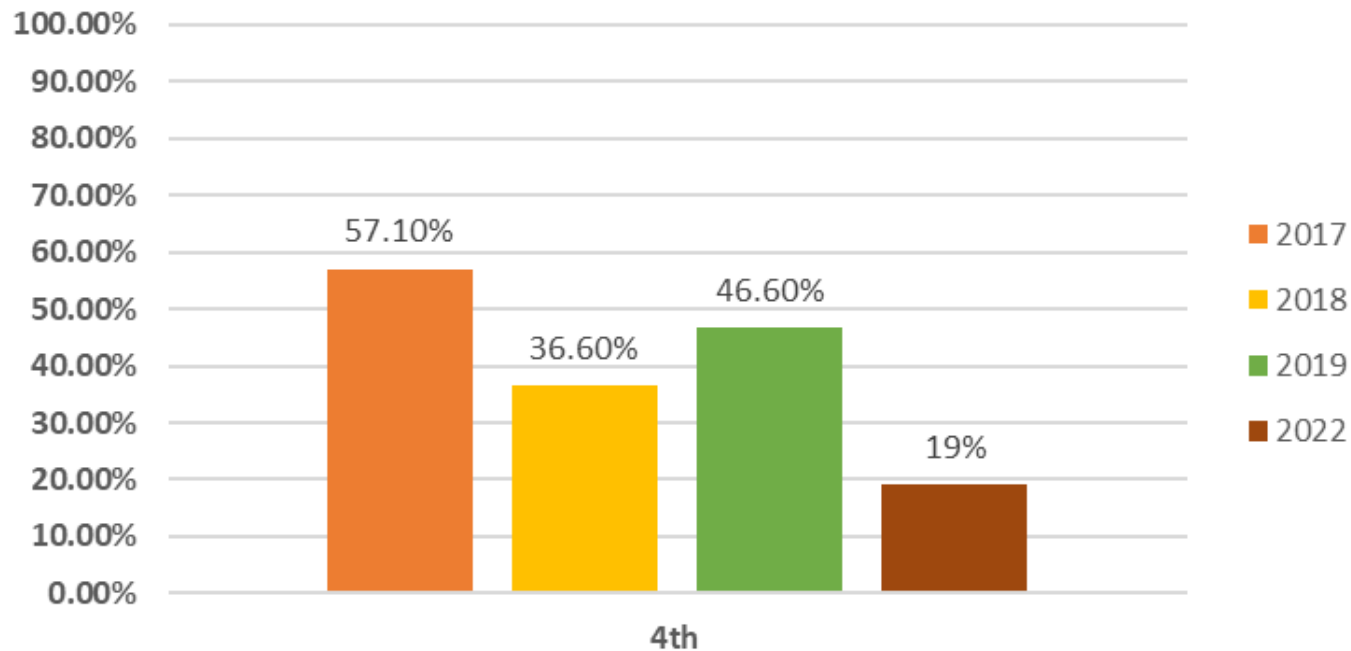
