Report to Parents for 2021-2022

Sheridan Elementary School experienced a successful return to face-to-face instruction this school year. We have a total of 475 students in which 6 % of the population are English Second Language Learners and 9 % are special needs. Teachers continued to utilize their technology skills as they served students both online and in person. Despite the learning loss our students made significant gains in ELA and Math on their MAP assessments in grades kindergarten through fifth. This school year our focus was on the South Carolina Career Ready Priority Standards.

Report to Parents for 2021-2022

Our main goal at Sheridan Elementary is to help all students to develop the world-class knowledge, world-class skills, and life and career characteristics as outlined in the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. We believe that with teachers, students, parents, administrators, community members, and business partners working together in a safe and positive school environment, we can develop our students into technology proficient, lifelong learners, and productive, global citizens. Our learning opportunities for the students here at Sheridan consist of the following:

- 1) 1:1 iPads for students in grades Pre- Kindergarten through Second Grades and 1:1 Chromebooks for students in grades Third through Fifth.
- 2) Letterland is used as a Reading intervention program
- 3) Dreambox is used as a Math intervention program
- 4) All classrooms are equipped with Cleartouch boards and OWL camera devices.
- 5) Use of Mastery Connect and MAP for formative and summative assessments.
- 6) Small group intervention instruction in ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies.
- 7) FOSS kits are used as part of our school Science program.

Report to Parents for 2021-2022

The use of Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) includes weekly reviews of student work, student achievement data analysis, implementation of effective instructional practices, and reviews of current research. This year we partnered with NIET (National Institute for Excellent in Teaching) to improve Tier one instruction. Although limited by COVID, our community project this year included a hat, socks and gloves drive for our local nursing homes. Our teachers, staff, administrators, PTO, SIC, business partners and community members work together to meet the academic, social, emotional and physical needs of our students. We at Sheridan are committed to providing our students with a high-quality education that allow them to develop into well rounded, productive citizens that can compete in a global society.



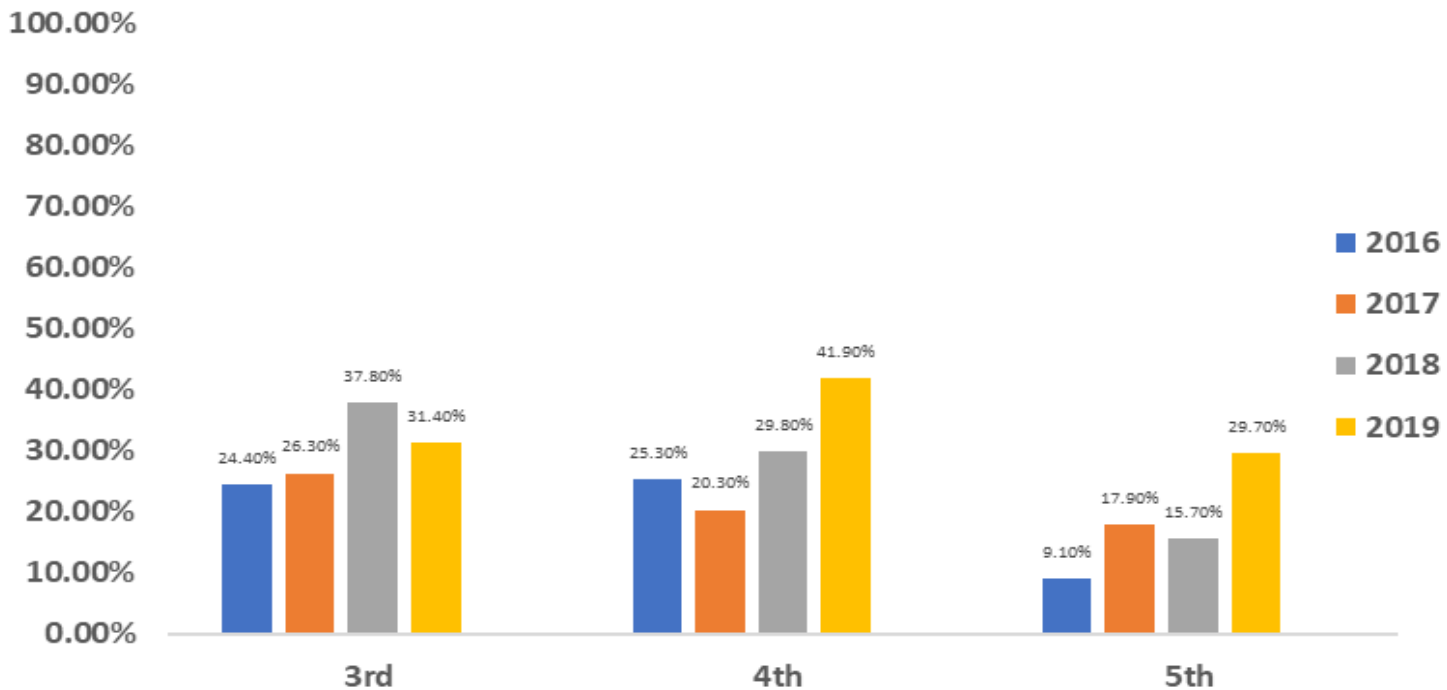

South Carolina College-and-Career Ready Assessment (SC READY)

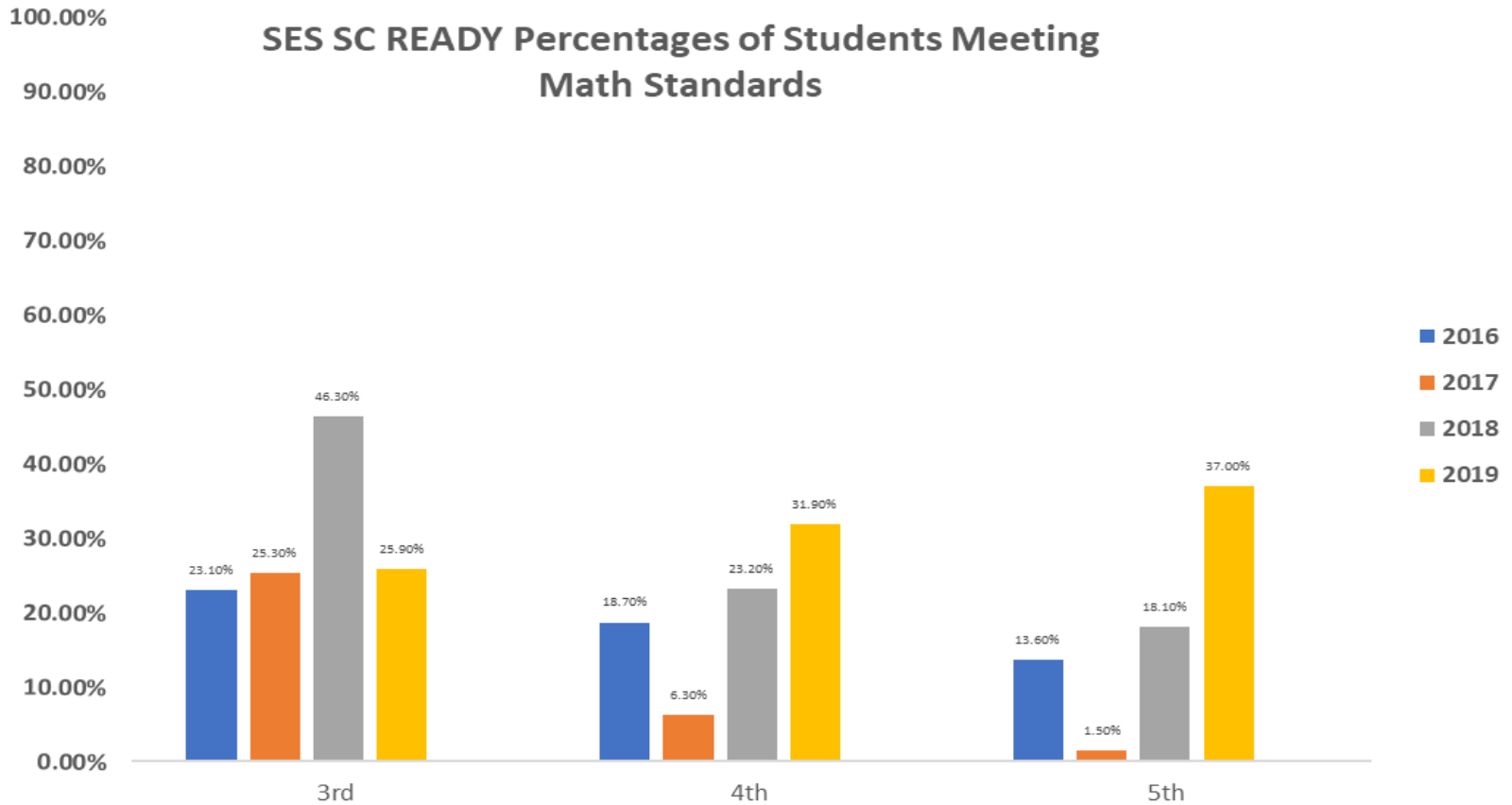


SES SC READY Percentage of Students Meeting ELA Standards

SES SC READY Percentages of Students Meeting Math Standards



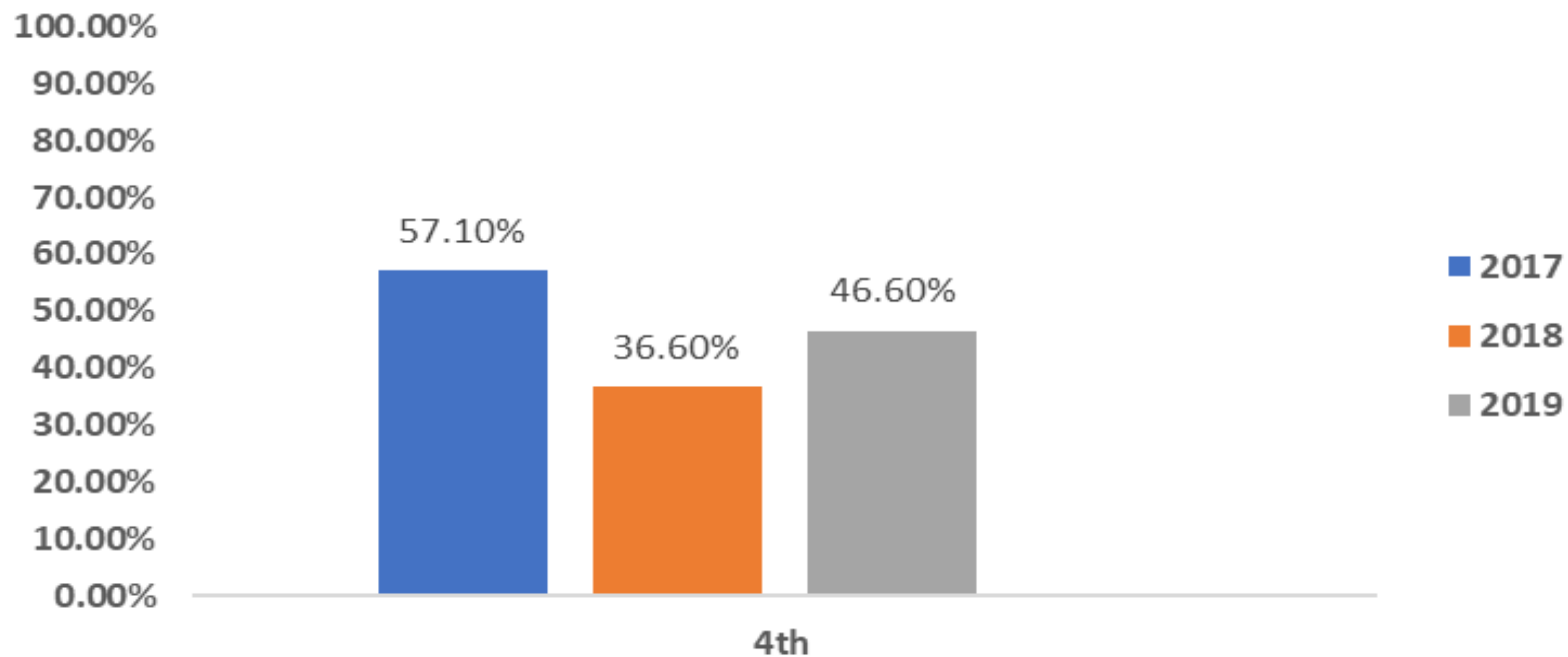


South Carolina Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (SC PASS)

Data reflects pre-pandemic test scores

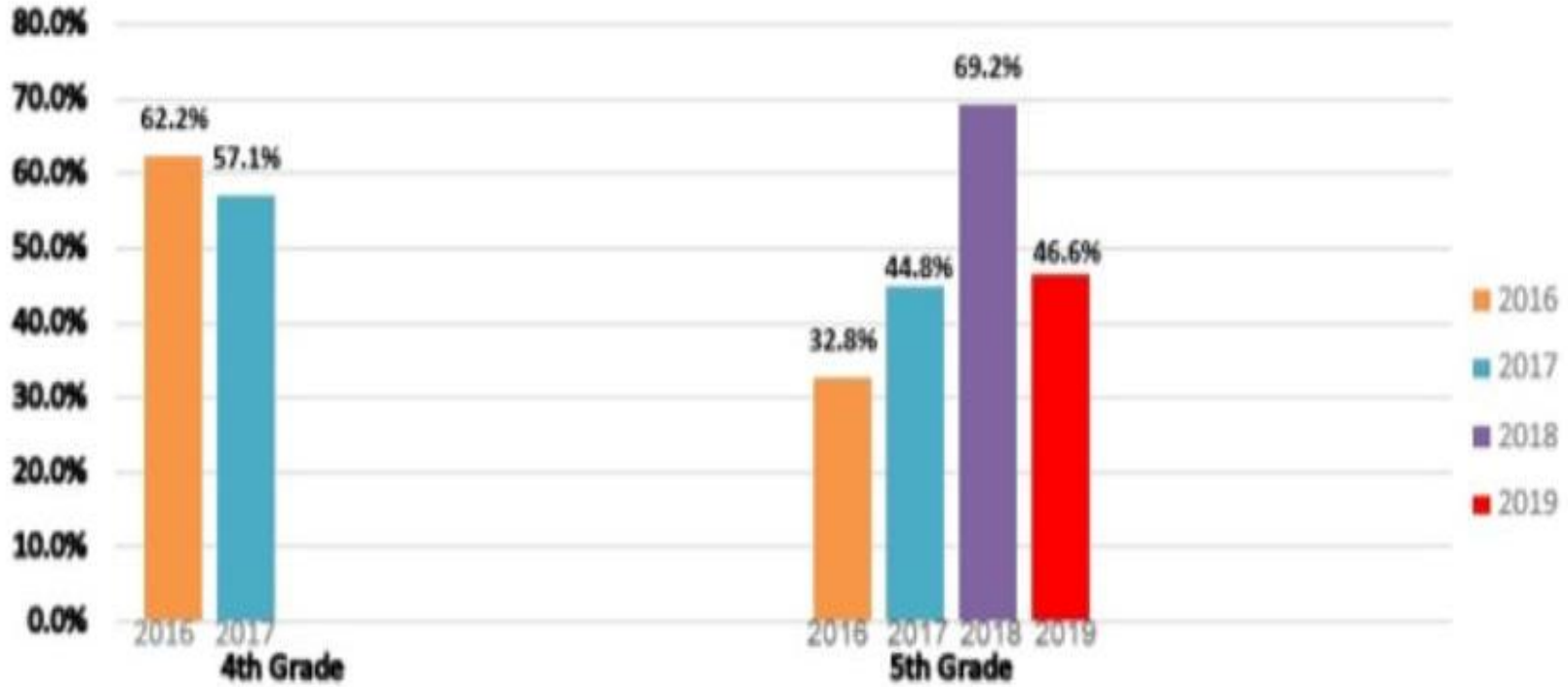

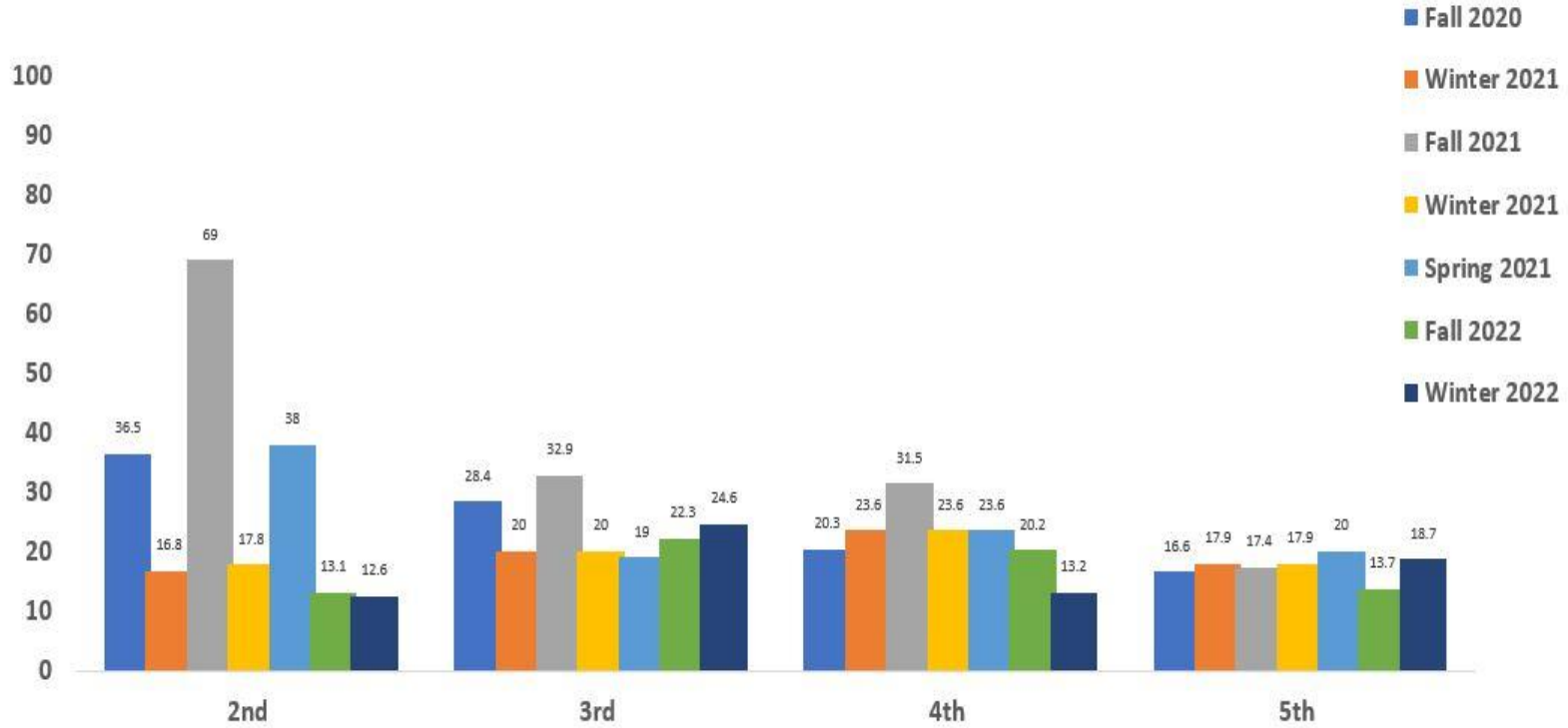
SC PASS % Meeting Social Studies Standards



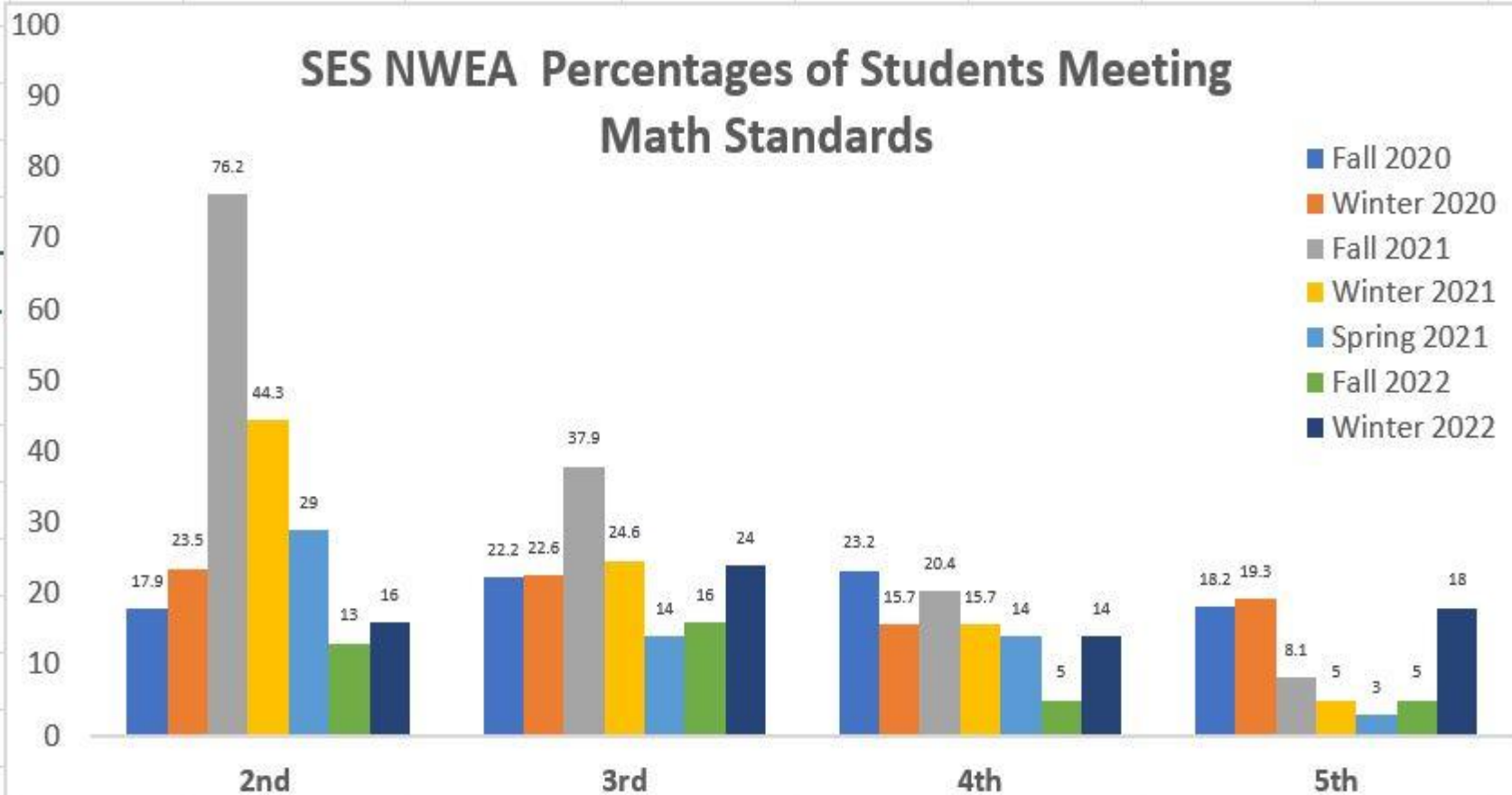




SES NWEA Percentages of Students Meeting ELA Standards



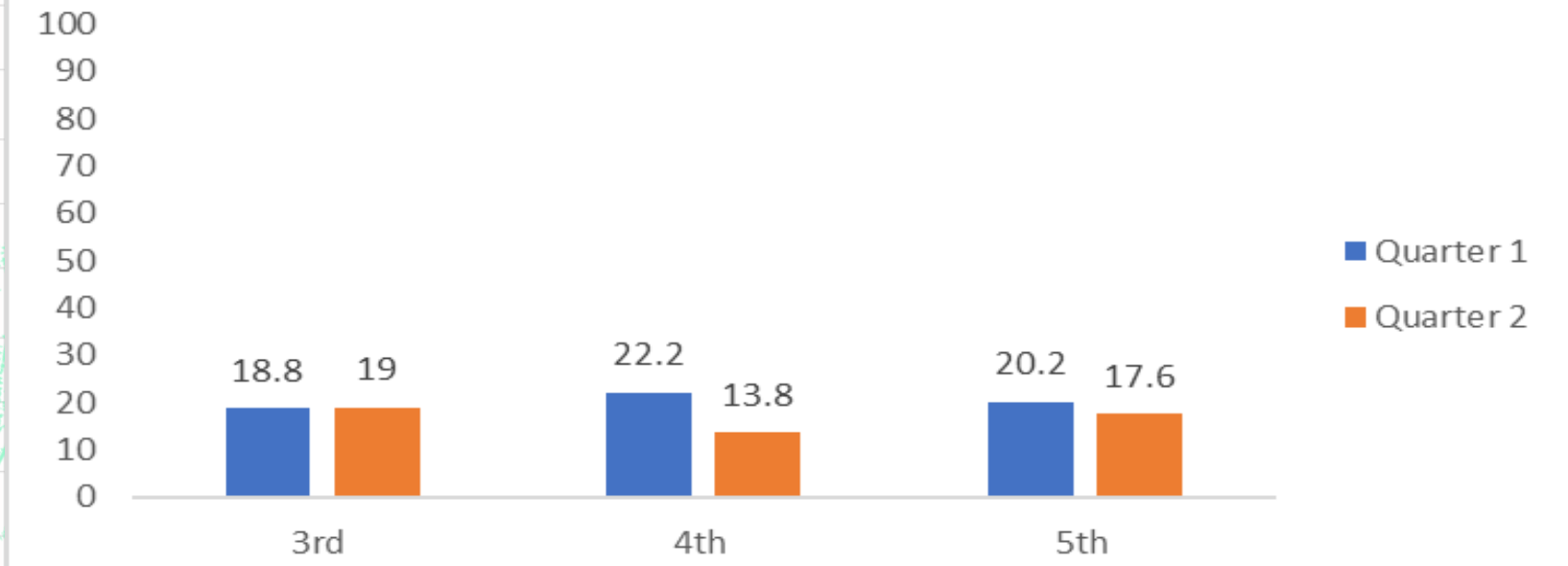
SES NWEA Percentages of Students Meeting Math Standards

SES Percentages of Students Projected Proficiency on the District's ELA Quarterly Benchmark Assessments

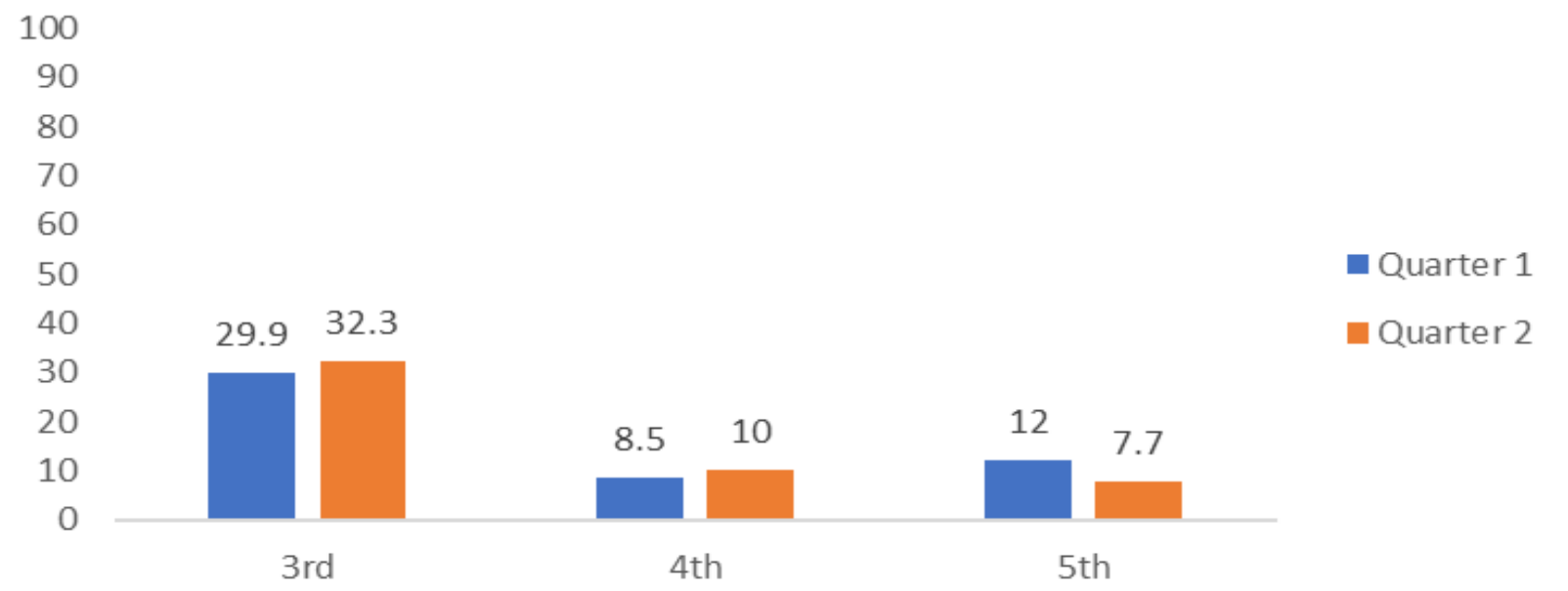

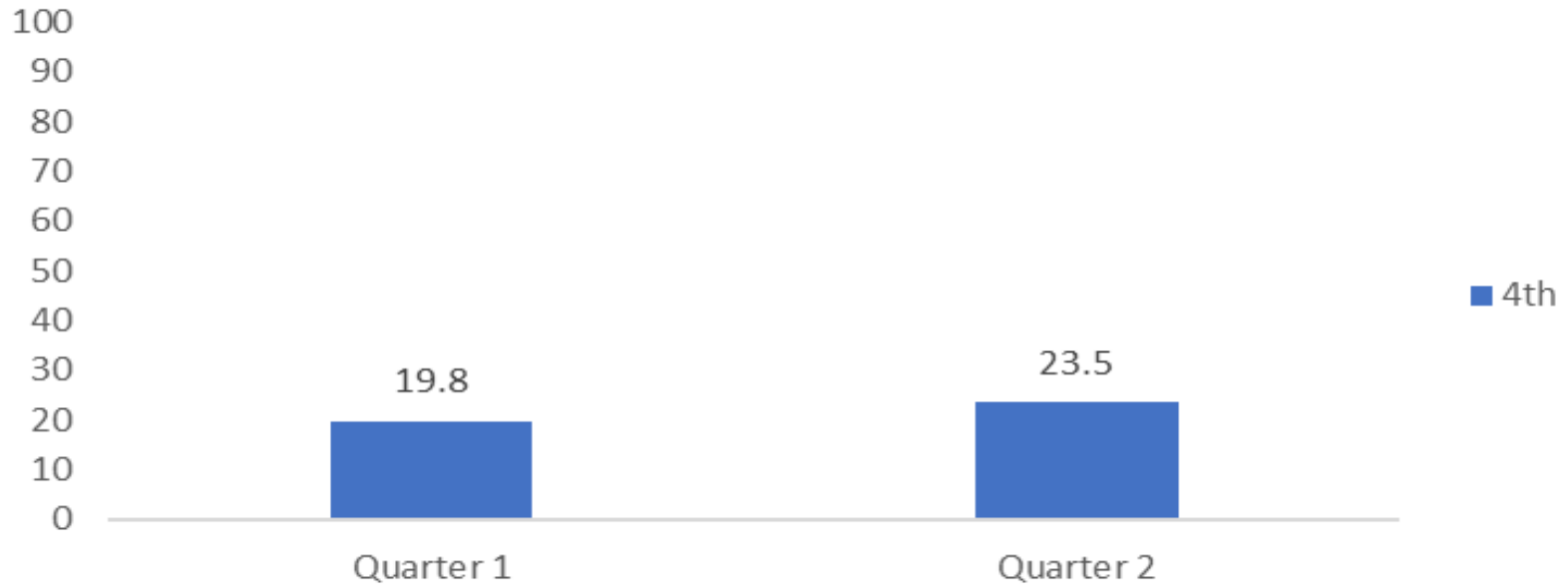



SES Percentages of Students Projected Proficiency on the District's Math Quarterly Benchmark Assessments
