SIC Annual Goals (2018-2023)

Our school will:

- increase our graduation rate by 2.5 percentage points over the next five years. Goal NOT met Graduation rate decreased by .8 %.
- 2. increase our SAT composite score by 25 points over the next five years. Goal NOT met. The composite score increased by 1 point.
- increase our ACT composite score by 2.5 points over the next five years. Goal NOT met. Our scores decreased by .5% point.
- increase our ACT school day composite score by 2.5 points over the next five years. Goal NOT met. Our ACT scores stayed the same.
- 5. increase the proportion of students who meet the standard (at least a 3) for the National Career Readiness Certificate by 5 percentage points over the next five years.
 Goal NOT met. Students scored higher in Location for Info and Reading for Info by 5 points in previous year.
- 6. increase the AP passing rate of a 3 or higher by 5
 percentage points over the next five years. Goal NOT met.
 More students took AP exams so there were 5% fewer making a 3 or higher.
- increase the percentage of students who make an A, B, or
 C on the all EOC assessments by 10 points (Algebra, English, Biology, and US History). Goal NOT met. Student scores dropped in all EOC tests except US History by 2%-8% points.
- increase the percentage of students who pass with at least a D on all EOC assessments by 10 points (Algebra, English, Biology, and US History). Goal NOT met. See score information in the table listed below.
- decrease the gap between minority students and the majority student population in all EOC assessment areas.
 Goal MET. Minority students scored higher by .5% on all of the EOC classes except Algebra 1.
- have at least 96% of our teachers return each year over the next five years. Goal met. 81% of the teachers returned last year which is up from 76%.
- 11. have a teacher attendance rate of at least 96% over the next five years. Goal met. We have an absence rate of 7 days per teacher per year. This equates to approx. 94% attendance rate.
- 12. increase each Climate area by 5 points. Goal NOT met. School report card shows climate down in students, parents and teachers.
