2021-2022 School Profile

T.L. Hanna High School is a public high school in the Anderson 5 School District of Anderson, South Carolina. The school maintains accreditation through AdvanceEd and the South Carolina Department of Education, providing a challenging college preparatory program.

Academic Program T.L. Hanna operates on a semester block schedule. Students are enrolled in four 90-minute classes each semester, completing 8 credits each year. The South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy informs procedures for class ranking and weighted GPA calculations. A high school diploma requires a minimum 24 credits, and students preparing for a four-year college complete additional course-

School counselors help students develop an individualized graduation plan based on their career interests and academic performance. In alignment with the school mission, every freshman is required to take College and Career Readiness. For their additional electives, students may choose from courses at the Hanna campus, the Southwood Academy of the Arts, and the Anderson Institute of Technology (AIT). This year, AP Human Geography was added as an advanced course for freshmen, and the Marketing Management program was added to expand our business course offerings.

AIT boasts 20 career programs. Students may earn an industry certification, work on a capstone project, and complete an internship with one of our local business partners. Tri-County Technical College also offers six state-funded dual credit Pathways Programs that students may begin in high school.

Advanced Coursework Students are encouraged to challenge themselves academically. Beyond the college preparatory level, we offer honors, advanced placement (AP), and dual credit. Twelve AP courses are offered yearlong on the block schedule, so students receive double the instructional time as compared with a traditional schedule. The school district maintains a dual enrollment agreement with Anderson University and Tri-County Technical College for over 20 courses at each college.
