SIC Annual Goals

- The average score on the ACT plus Writing will increase from the baseline scores to the following by 2018: English (18.3), Mathematics (19.7), Reading (20), and Science (19.9).
 Goal MET in 3 of the 4 goals: Our interim goals were met in English, Mathematics, and Science.
- 2. The percent of students who score at least a Silver (level 3) on WorkKeys will increase by 5% by 2018.
 - Goal NOT MET: Based on results from spring of 2016 testing, 71.8 % achieved at least a silver status. This was the same percentage as spring of 2015.
- 3. To reach 90 % graduation rate by 2018. Goal MET: The graduation rate was 85.7%, which was above our interim goal for this past year.
