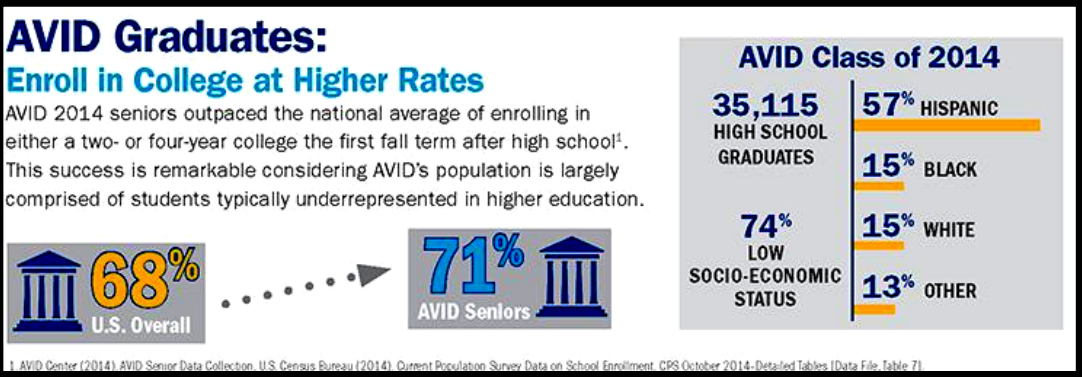

"AVID, Advancement Via Individual Determination, is a global nonprofit organization dedicated to closing the achievement gap by preparing all students for college and other postsecondary opportunities. Established more than 35 years ago, AVID today impacts near-

ly 1.5 million students in 46 states and 16 other countries/territories. AVID is not just another program... it is a philosophy; hold students accountable to the highest standards, provide academic and social support, and they will rise to the challenge. It brings re-

search-based strategies and curriculum into the school to prepare students for success. Through the use of focused note-taking, staying organized, and using critical reading, writing, and thinking, Lakeside has become an AVID certified school for the 2nd year.



Robert Anderson is a National Demonstration AVID School; when we merge next year, we will re-certify together as a National Demonstration School. AVID is a system used throughout both schools, but is also offered as an Elective class for students who need a little extra support in succeeding in accelerated and honors classes.

Student Achievement

MAP Data 2016 – 2017:

Lakeside students have met or exceeded projected growth in Mathematics, Reading, and Language Usage from Fall 2016 to Spring 2017

Average RIT scores in Mathematics improved in 2 out of 3 grade levels from 2015-16 to 2016-17

Average RIT scores in Reading improved or maintained in 2 out of 3 grade levels from 2015-16 to 2016-17.

SC PASS Data 2015- 2016:

53.3 % of students scored either MET or EXEMPLARY on SC PASS Science.

63.1 % of students scored either MET or EXEMPLARY on SC PASS Social Studies

SC Ready Data 2015 – 2016:

65% of our students either Exceed, Meet, or are Approaching Expectations in ELA

58% of our students either Exceed, Meet , or are Approaching Expectations in Math

EOC Data 2015 – 2016:

100% of our students scored 70 or above on the Algebra 1 EOC.

97% of our students scored 70 or

above on the English I EOC.

SIC Annual Goals



◇ The Percentage of students in grades 6-8 that score Met or Exemplary on PASS Science and Social Studies will increase by 5% in Five years.

Goal NOT MET: Based on results from spring of 2016 testing, we know that the 63.1% of students scored Met or Exemplary, down from 51.3 % in the previous year.

◇ 100% of teachers at Lakeside Middle will be highly qualified as determined by the South Carolina Certification Guidelines.

Goal MET: 100% of teachers at Lakeside Middle are highly qualified as determined by the South Carolina Certification Guidelines

◇ 100% of math, science, social studies, and ELA teachers in grades 7-8 will be middle level certified in the area in which they teach.

Goal NOT MET: 88% of the teachers at Lakeside Middle are middle level certified in the area in which they teach.

Additional Information

Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by providing a rigorous standards-based curriculum; STEM-based elective courses such as SmartLab, Game Design, and Robotics; 1:1 Technology integration through Chromebooks; AVID best practice strategies which emphasize literacy across the curriculum, an inquiry-based approach to learning, and opportunities for collaborative learning; an RTI approach where levels of support meet students' needs; an Advisory program which helps students develop skills for success in education and the workplace; and a school culture which emphasizes excellence in the athletics, arts, academics, and attitude.



Lakeside was approved for two programs that have tremendously assisted our parents, teachers, and our students. Lakeside was named a Title I school, which afforded the opportunity to provide professional development resources for our teachers as well as materials and supplies for our teachers and students. Also, we were titled a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school, which made it possible for all students to be provided a free breakfast and a free lunch.
