Wrestling was region champions and state runners-up.
Competitive Cheer won a $7^{\text {th }}$ consecutive state title.

The LHS Arts Department presented You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown.

Advanced Art students completed an aerial rendition of LHS to be presented and displayed at the Pickens County Career and Technology Center.

Valerie Boatwright was elected to serve on the SC Association of School Librarians Executive Board.
RJ Little was selected to be a member of the SC All State Chorus.
Josh Ryder was selected to be a member of the SC All State Band.
The LHS Symphonic Band received a rating of Excellent at Concert Festival.

## Student Achievement

Liberty High School had an Absolute Rating of GOOD and a Growth Rating of AVERAGE for 2012
Students showed growth on HSAP with an increase to $80.4 \%$ passing 2 subtests.
LHS showed significant growth in the Four-Year Cohort Graduation Rate (On Time Graduation Rate) to 71.1\%.
The Five-Year Graduation Rate for LHS climbed to 66.3\%.
LHS had an $86.5 \%$ pass rate on the Biology End of Course Examination.

## Additional Information

Students at Liberty High School have opportunities to excel in academics, arts, and athletics. Our school offers a wide variety of honors and Advanced Placement level courses. Students may take courses in art, chorus, drama, strings orchestra, symphonic band, and music appreciation. Students have opportunities for extra-curricular activities with school-wide musicals, art club, dram a productions, arts concerts, marching band, and concert band. In athletics, students have participation opportunities in football, volleyball, competitive cheer, girls and boys golf, girls and boys cross country, wrestling, girls and boys basketball, baseball, softball, and girls and boys track. Students may take specialized physical education courses in weightlifting, basketball, archery, baseball, softball, and ultimate Frisbee. Our school has an Army JROTC program that includes a Raider team, Color Guard team, and Rifle team. Throughout the year, students participate in extra-curricular opportunities through Student Government Association, Beta Club, International Thespian Honor Society, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and Special Olympics Peer Assistants.
