- West End is served by 45 teachers, 33 staff members, and 2 administrators.

Our teachers implement the South Carolina college and Career Ready Standards. They analyze multiple data sources including MAP, SCReady, SCPASS, and classroom assessments. The teachers design their instruction based on student and instructional strengths and weaknesses found in data.

On spring 2023 MAP assessment, students in grades 3 and 4 demonstrated more than one year's growth in reading and math. Students in grade 5 demonstrated just under a year's growth in reading and math.

A morning meeting program helps build a strong sense of classroom community and develops social skills and addresses social-emotional learning needs.

Partnering with parents in the education of children is important to all at west End. We work to provide educational opportunities for parents during the school day, after school, and off campus. Our family liaison works with families who struggle due to inadequate resources.
