Because of an uncompromising commitment to student learning and achievement, the mission of A.C. flora High School is to provide the environment, learning opportunities, and standards of expectation that assure each student an understanding of his or her potential, the service experiences that promote active citizenship in a global society, and the skills and knowledge that enable a lifetime of achievement.

School Highlights & Awards

Students have risen to the challenge of taking more rigorous course and have excelled as a result. We are giving a total of 14 AP exams to 702 students – this is 50 % of the student body. Additionally, 71 IB students will take 547 assessments. As of April 2018, Flora is proud to announce four National Merit Finalists, one National Merit Commended Student, and 121 High School Scholars. We anticipate that the senior class will earn over \$20,000,000.00 in scholarships. Approximately 215 students are members of the National Honor Society. The arts at Flora are also flourishing. The Theater, Dance, and Choral departments presented the musical *Footloose* while each individual fine arts department also presented productions. A. C. Flora athletics is strong with 733 students competing on 51 teams in 24 sports.
