TEN80 STEM RACING

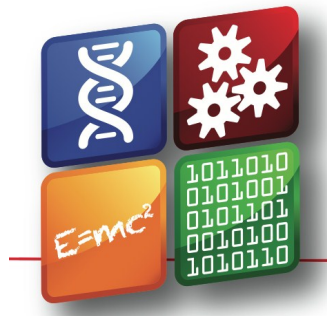

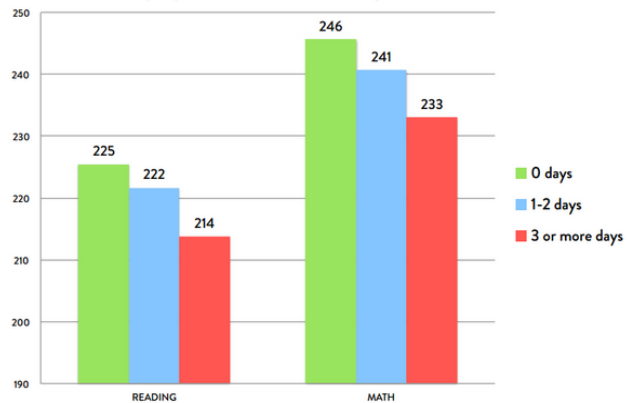
ATTENDANCE MATTERS

According to the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) (2014), generally referred to as the nation’s report card, 4th and 8th graders were administered a reading and math test in 2013 to determine how attendance correlates with test scores. Those students who reported attending school daily had higher averages than those

who reported missing three or more days. The Attendance Works contends—“Amid the sometimes fierce debate about improving our nation’s schools lies an indisputable truth: Students must attend school regularly to benefit from what is taught there.”
